### **Greater Pasadena Council**

**Feb 28 2008**

Yes, there is a Greater Pasadena Council. I am sorry for no report on the last three months, but there was no meeting in November because of Thanksgiving (4th Thursday), December was their Christmas party -- I had seasonal conflicts and in January I had no

viable wheels. From the January minutes: Col. George Johnson of the Maryland Natural Resource Police was the speaker. He explained the Mission Statement which is: "Maryland Natural Resource Police (NRP) serves as a public safety agency with statewide authority. To enforce conservation, boating and all criminal laws, as well as, to provide primary law enforcement for MD State parks, State forests, public lands owned and managed by Maryland." The agency is responsible for Maritime and rural search and rescue and is designated as the state's agency for homeland security for MD waters. It is a conservation police agency. They enforce all the laws pertaining to the waterways (17,000 miles), 1/2 million acres of state property, and 49 state parks that they are responsible for. They are authorized 280 officers statewide but have only 232 positions filled. NRP comes under the umbrella of the Department of Natural Resources. The Secretary is John Griffin and the Deputy Secretary is Eric Schwab. They have the same powers as the state police. If you have a particular complaint call, 410-260-8888.

The February meeting was called to order at 7:30. The speaker was canceled due to the flu. He was from the AA Co. Recycling Project, Waste Management. He will be rescheduled for the March meeting. Treasurer's report said that there are 38 members and that the fiscal year ends Feb. 29th. The flag fund is in good shape but contributions are always welcome. There were no committee reports. Mike Cadogan is moving to Florida and has resigned as President. Terry Pilgrom will assume the office of President effective immediately.

The price of participation is \$500 for which a \$500 tax credit has been legislated and provided for on the 502 Maryland Income Tax form. Without the cooperation of our state leaders this part of the program would not be possible. A technician will visit all "hotel" sites four times a year to ensure the development of spat into oysters mature enough to drop to the all-important reefs. I am a volunteer and will receive nothing except satisfaction knowing that the neighbors that so truly depend on the bay and surrounding rivers for enjoyment are responding to help restore a true asset to our lives.
