The meeting was called to order at 7:05 at the home of Lisa Schell.

Roads & Zoning: Rick contacted the owners of Property at 414-422 Park Creek Road about keeping the mailbox area clean of trash, newspapers and debris. Rick also contacted Keith Dowling who is overseeing the property at 426 Park Creek Road. He agreed to get the grass cut and remove debris from the yard. He is repairing the house in preparation of renting it soon. Rick explained that if the yard was not cleaned up by August 11, he would ask the county to do it and bill Mr. Dowling. The owners of 345 Edgewater Road clarified that their new construction requires the removal of three trees, which as been approved by the county. They also agreed that no more than three garage spaces would exist once the new house is completed. The new house satisfies all setback requirements, as shown on the plan. This construction had been approved at the last meeting.

The Merciers at 1147 Valley Drive applied to remove a dead tree. Approval from the county to have a tree removed was not needed. Motion to approve tree removal. Seconded, all in favor so it carried.

Membership: A total paid membership as of tonight is \$11,500 from 141 households. Sixty second notices went out the beginning of July.

Park: Bud reported that he cleaned up the basketball court from the firework debris. He also installed the new chain basketball net for the hoop. The playground was edged and weeded and the storm drain on Edgewater was cleaned out. Weeding is an on going project and **Bud is looking for volunteers**. Bud has also ordered two new swings for the playground. They should be installed by the beginning of September. Discussion of ordering new mulch for the playground led to forming a work party in March to help with the clean-up, removal of old monkey bars and spreading of mulch. This will be addressed in the January meeting. Also **looking for students to earn their community service hours** by helping with various community projects.

Pier: Rich reported that a tree came down during one of the recent storms. Rich would like to thank Carl & Fran Kuhne, David Rayford, Dane Mariner, Ted Tepper, Todd Heath, Leslie Sater & Denny Debus for helping with the tree removal, grass cutting and cleanup of grass clippings. A resident reported to Rich that their anchor had been stolen from their boat.

Rich also reports that there are a limited amount of parking spaces down at the pier.

Please do not leave your trailer longer then **24 hours**. And **NO** storing of boats or trailers in the pier area.

Beach: There was vandalism at the beach. Damage consisted of a hole made in the Beach sign, flipping the picnic tables over causing the seats to come off. The tarp was ripped with a knife. The porta-potty was tipped over and the circuit breakers tripped. A police report has been filed. The Police Department said they will try to increase the amount of patrols through the neighborhood. There was discussion in the consideration of implementing a Community Watch Program. Rick asks that **anyone with any information in the vandalism or interest in the community watch to call a Board Member**.

U.S. Post Office Mailbox Instructions

1. Whenever possible, boxes must be located so that carrier's vehicle is off pavement when serving them.

2. Rural box number (or house number) must be painted on box in numerals no less than one inch.
3. Post must be neat and of adequate strength and size.
4. Approach to box should be a hard level surface (gravel, cinders, stone).
5. Boxes must be placed to conform with state laws and highway regulations.
