The meeting was called to order at 7:17 PM at the home of Rae Regula.

A motion was made by NSA Vice-President Lois Warner to approve the minutes from the September 7, 2010 meeting. Motion approved by Rae Regula, seconded by Robyn Gearhart-Sayler. All were in favor, motion carried.

Roads and Zoning: Lois Warner reported that she will call the county this week about arranging for a Dumpster for community clean-up. She will contact the county about a more forgiving curb at the North Shore Rd. exit onto Mountain Road Eastbound.

Beach: Roberta Watts reported for Rick Watts that we need volunteers to help take down the nettle net. Date set for Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup> at 10 am.

Park: Rae Regula reported that the recent deluge had flooded the park with 8" of water and shifted the playground mulch to areas of the basketball court, drains, and low spots. She needs volunteers to help move mulch back to the play area. This will piggyback on the Nettle Net day: Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup> at 10 am. Volunteers can have this count towards community service hours. Rae Regula wants to thank Denny Debus for all of his help keeping the park in order during the flood. There were MANY neighbors who chipped in at the North Shore Park, Marina, and Beach, as well as along the waterfront.

Entertainment: Jennifer reported that the Crab Feast was a great success. We made about \$1000 and had over 90 people in attendance! Thanks to all who brought dishes and helped with the feast.

Halloween is the next event. Jennifer hopes to have an adult hayride on Friday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting. 7:30 at the community beach. The Family bonfire and Halloween party will be Saturday Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm at the beach. We will provide pizza and juice boxes, a costume contest and games. Sunday Oct 31: No events scheduled. This is trick or treat night!

Garden Club: Sarah Ann Parsons reported that the Christmas tour will be December 10<sup>th</sup>. First house is the Kellum's on Ginn Lane, followed by the Watts' on Park Creek Road. We will need volunteers to supply and drive golf carts for ease of access. Contact Sarah Ann if you can help with this part of the tour.

The old construction permit has been thrown out, and the electric permits combined under one fee. Phil Gerber will help with the electric permit updates. Brian will be changing the locks to the boat ramp next year. New keys will be supplied.

Pier Committee: Denise reported that she has researched several other marina rules/regulations to help update North Shore on the Magothy's rules. The pier committee will meet to finalize the rules which will then be posted for review and proposed at the next North Shore on the Magothy General Meeting in February, 2011.

Old Business: Lois Warner brought up the need for more Fund Raiser ideas. What about a polar bear plunge? Roberta Watts suggested all board members bake something to sell at the yard sale.

New Business: Denise Larbig reported that she has been called several times about kids loitering at the Beach pavilion after dark. In an effort to cut down on such trespassing, she motioned that there be a temporary change to the posted hours at the North Shore Beach and Park. Except for community sanctioned events and slip holders, the Beach and Park would be closed from Dusk to Dawn. Trespassing could then be reported to the police. This change in hours would take place immediately, to be reviewed and voted on at the General Meeting in February 2011. Roberta Watts approved the motion, and Rae Regula seconded. None opposed, the motion carried.

### Grilled Pork Roast With Fruit Compote

Prep: 15 min.; Grill: 1 hr., 5 min.; Stand: 10 min.  
If you'd rather not mess with tying the roast, ask the butcher to do it for you.

Perfect Partner: 2005 DelFosse, Cabernet Franc, Virginia; 2005 Columbia Crest, Two Vines Vineyard 10 Red, Washington

Preparation Time: 15 minutes minutes

Cooking Time: 1 hour, 5 minutes minutes

Other Time: 10 minutes minutes

Yield: Makes 8 servings

- 1 (4-lb.) boneless pork loin roast, trimmed
- Kitchen string
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons chopped garlic
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh rosemary
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme
- 2 tablespoons olive oil

### Fruit Compote

1. Tie pork with kitchen string, securing at 2-inch intervals. Sprinkle pork with salt and pepper. Stir together garlic and next 3 ingredients. Rub over pork.

2. Light 1 side of a grill, heating to 350° to 400° (medium-high); leave other side unlit. Place



pork over lit side, and grill, covered with grill lid, 8 to 10 minutes on each side or until browned. Move pork over unlit side, and grill, covered with grill lid, 45

minutes or until a meat thermometer inserted into thickest portion registers 145° to 150°. Let stand 10 minutes before slicing. Serve with Fruit Compote.
