July 6, 2010
Minutes for North Shore Association

Board Members Present: Denise Larbig, Philip Gerber, Bonnie Howatt, Rick Watts, Roberta Watts, Lois Warner, Rae Regula, Jennifer King, Brian Ferguson

Guests: Marty Gavin, William Paul, Margo Melotti, Ed Melotti, Carl Kuhne, Shep Drain, Denny Debus, Rick Scruggs, Bud Jenkins

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM at the home of Richard and Roberta Watts.

A motion was made by NSA President Denise Larbig to approve the minutes from the June 1, 2010 meeting. Motion approved by Lois Warner, seconded by Rick Watts. All were in favor, motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: There was no old business to discuss.

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:

Roads and Zoning: Lois Warner reported that neighbors have requested that the bushes beside "Spradlin" Boulevard (the gravel path cut through from the park to Dutchship Road) be trimmed back due to low visibility for the kids coming down to the park. Lois will contact the neighbor on the path, Glen Ebaugh, and ask if he/we can trim them back.

Due to the attendance of many guests concerned with North Shore Marina, Denise Larbig recommended that the Pier chairperson report next:

Pier: Brian Ferguson reported

Volunteer Corner:

Special Thanks to the following for their extra efforts in assisting at the Marina.

- Denny Debus volunteered to drain all pipes before winter and winterize the pumps.
- Bob Leigh for his continued assistance at the Marina with the Ice eaters.

The following notes are the result of the open 7/6/10 board meeting:

RE: The Retaining Wall at the community pier

The retaining wall/bulkhead at the left of the ramp has pulled away from the land and could collapse. It is thought that this is caused by not only the parking of heavy vehicles along that side of the ramp but also the lack of deadmen installed at the corner. In regards to the type of repair needed, Brian researched either a small fix of using the existing wall with deadmen to keep the corner in place or replace the entire wall with new lumber and materials. Shep Drain

then informed the board that there already exist deadmen supports in the bulkhead to the left of the ramp, although not at or near the corner in question. There should be several deadmen (3 countersunk bolts) that one could see from the front of the bulkhead. This was done several years back (over 12) but the materials should be good for 30 years. Several guests also noted that the existing bulkhead was pile driven in and is actually in front of a pre-existing bulkhead that was jetted into place.

Conclusion: Due to the fact that deadmen already exist at the site, Brian Ferguson recommended that we select the proposal that works with the existing bulkhead wall, digging out the area behind it to check existing deadmen and adding two at the corner, and then backfill. Motion was made to go with this lower estimate of \$5,000.00. Motion approved by Brian Ferguson, and seconded by Phil Gerber. All were in favor, motion carried.

Denny Debus asked that immediate action take place where the dirt has washed away behind the bulkhead wall. It was recommended that the area be temporarily bridged by boards to prevent falls.

The board favored a recommendation of relocating the parking area for trailers by moving the western edge towards the park and posting a “Members Trailer Only” sign at that location. This is to be discussed in committee and then recommendations given to the board.

RE: The Ramp

Several guests and board members commented on the hole, that at low tide could make it difficult to remove your trailers from the North Shore ramp. Although a cage was thought to have been installed several years ago, no one in attendance could comment on the actual status of said cage’s existence. It was noted by several guests that the powering-up of boats to get onto their trailers is a main cause of the erosion at the ramp.

Conclusion: Brian will get estimates for repairing the ramp and adding a cage and additional stone at the base of the ramp. Place a “Do Not Power Up Boat” sign at the pier entrance. Brian noted that any work done on the ramp would not happen until this winter.

RE: Ramp Key

It has come to the attention of the board that many unauthorized boaters use the boat ramp indicating that the ramp keys are being shared since they cannot be copied. The current rules are that only paid North Shore on the Magothy members are entitled to purchase a key. The ramp can only be used by members who have applied for and own a key. If they chose to allow an unauthorized person to launch a vessel, that member must be in attendance and the trailer hauled away from the marina during use.

Conclusion: Brian will post an enforceable “Members Only/No Trespassing” sign at the ramp. There will be increased policing of the boat ramp and all neighbors are encouraged to report the tag numbers of trespassers at the marina. The board and guests discussed the option of charging a nominal annual boat ramp fee to all ramp users, not just slip owners.

RE: Boat Slips

All slip fees have been paid for 2010. It was requested by some long time residents that the Marina re-establish and maintain a seniority list. William Paul noted that a good set of rules existed in the 70-80s for the Marina and over the last 30 years have not been enforced. There was some question about the whereabouts of the rules, but all agreed they need to be reviewed by committee and send recommendations to the Board to then be published in the Barnacle and posted on site.

Conclusion: A Pier Committee made up of board members and residents was established to look up and review/revise the rules for the boat slips and ramp that would then be presented to the NS Board.

The Pier Committee: William Paul, Phil Gerber, Shep Drain, Brian Ferguson, Denise Larbig, Ed Melotti, Margo Melotti and Rick Scruggs.

RE: Marina Clean-up Days Spring/Fall

The recommendation that slip owners who fail to help on at least one of two clean up days be charged was met with mixed reaction. This is something for the Pier Committee to review and note in the rules.

RE: Shed

The shed is in need of replacement. This shed holds the water conditioner, water tank, electrical box that services the marina. Committee to review options and make recommendations.

Membership: Philip Gerber reported that there are 138 paid members.

Entertainment: Jennifer King reported that the North Shore July 4th Parade was well attended and the Lake Shore Fire Department led the parade with their fire truck. Bob Douglas led the Annual North Shore Beach wade-in test which indicated 19 inches clarity (less clarity than previous years). Cake and drinks were provided at the pavilion afterwards. The crab feast will be on September 11, 2010.

Beach: Rick Watts reported that the nettle net needs to be installed on Sunday July 11 at 10am. It was recommended that July 4 evening be a NON-rental time so that all neighbors can use the beach to view fireworks. It was discussed that the rental fee be raised for larger (50+) parties at the beach along with a deposit to ensure proper trash removal. This will be proposed at the annual meeting. Any paid North Shore Member interested in renting the beach should email Rick at rwatts418@verizon.net. The fee for renting the beach is \$50.

Park: Rae Regula no report.

Greater Pasadena Council: No report.

Garden Club: Sarah Ann Parsons absent. Rae Regula reported that the Luau Party is scheduled for Friday July 30th. Fliers to be distributed next week. Planning meeting will be July 20th at Sarah Ann's house at 7:30.

NEW BUSINESS:

Carl Kuhne noted that the non-conforming use sign at North Shore & Mountain Road is for as many as 5 single family/duplex homes on land owned by Edward Looper. As it is non-conforming application, no hearing or meeting is required. Concerned citizens need to visit the county office to review applicant's evidence once it has been submitted. The county has not assigned anyone to this application as of yet. This note submitted by Secretary post meeting.]

The Spirit of North Shore

I have lived in North Shore for seventeen years, so I do not qualify as an "Old Timer" yet. However, I have been here long enough to notice some changes that have occurred slowly over the years. Not all have been for the best.

Ask any of the true Old Timers, and they will tell you of the spirit of volunteerism that built and maintained the community. Did you know the marina was built solely with the sweat and time of your neighbors? Or that the beach and pavilion were created by residents on what had been a swamp? Only 15 years ago, I remember 50 volunteers showing up for spring "Clean Up Day". It usually ended with subs and beers from Pastore's and a sense of accomplishment by all.

Today I worry that too many people take North Shore for granted. Attendance at work parties has dwindled, and more things get "hired out" to professionals. A few people even have a destructive attitude, and think nothing of throwing their trash along the side of the road, or vandalizing community property.

There are still several residents who take it upon themselves to work quietly in the background and make this a better place – picking up trash along the road, making needed repairs when they see something broken, plowing our streets/digging out neighbors, or volunteering to help with community events. Thank you very much.

For those of you who may not have contributed much to the community lately, I ask if you would consider adopting one of the following levels of volunteerism for your community. These are listed from the lowest participation level to the highest:

Don't be destructive. Remove your trash from the park and beach when you leave. If nothing else, just leave things the way they are and don't create problems for everyone else. Keep your own property clean. When the garbage men spill trash on the ground at your driveway, pick it up. Clean up after your pets. Try and maintain your little piece of North Shore. Remember, all trash and pet waste ends up in our storm drains, which empty into our marina and creeks. Take a proactive roll and volunteer. We have an entertainment chairperson that can not do it all herself – so call and volunteer to help with a party. If you have a boat at the marina or use the ramp, help with work parties. Kids like the beach? Help with the nettle net! Call any board member and we will be glad to give you some ideas where help is needed. Volunteer for the board. Most Old Timers have served at least one three year term, if not twice. Fresh blood will be needed next February!

I know it is very hard to balance the stress of work, kids' activities, and our own household chores. Adding community service to the mix is not easy. But if everyone did just a little, it would help rejuvenate the spirit of North Shore.



Broccoli Salad With Lemon Pepper-Blue Cheese Dressing

MAKES 8 SERVINGS; PREP: 20 MIN.,

COOK: 5 MIN., **CHILL:** 2 HR.

A sprinkling of sugar creates the sweet-sharp taste of a traditional broccoli salad dressing, but you can reduce the amount if desired.

- 1/4 cup pine nuts
- 1 (4-oz.) package crumbled blue cheese
- 1/4 cup reduced-fat mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup reduced-fat sour cream
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 Tbsp. lemon zest
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice
- 2 tsp. freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. ground red pepper
- 6 cups chopped fresh broccoli (about 1 1/2 lb.)
- 1 1/2 cups chopped Gala apple (1 large apple)
- 1/4 cup dried cherries

1. Heat pine nuts in a small nonstick skillet over medium-low heat, stirring often, 4 to 5 minutes or until toasted and fragrant.
2. Whisk together blue cheese crumbles and next 8 ingredients in a large bowl; add broccoli, apple, and cherries, gently tossing to coat. Cover and chill 2 to 8 hours; stir in toasted pine nuts just before serving. ●

Sugar Snap-Snow Pea Salad

MAKES 4 SERVINGS; PREP: 10 MIN.,

COOK: 7 MIN.

- 1 1/2 cups trimmed fresh sugar snap peas (about 5 oz.)
- 1 1/2 cups trimmed fresh snow peas (about 6 oz.)
- 1 Tbsp. soy sauce
- 1 Tbsp. pomegranate or cranberry juice
- 1 Tbsp. white vinegar
- 1 Tbsp. canola oil
- 2 tsp. minced fresh ginger
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1 Tbsp. black or regular sesame seeds
- 1 cup frozen baby English peas, thawed

1. Arrange sugar snap peas and snow peas in a steamer basket over boiling water.

Cover and steam 1 to 2 minutes or until crisp-tender. Plunge peas into ice water to stop the cooking process; drain.

2. Whisk together soy sauce and next 5 ingredients in a large bowl.

3. Heat sesame seeds in a small nonstick skillet over medium-low heat, stirring often, 4 to 5 minutes or until toasted and

Tasting Notes

- Pennies a serving, toasted ramen noodles add a nutty crunch to salads and slaws.
- When fresh field peas are unavailable, frozen peas are our first choice for salads. Their texture is firmer and less starchy than canned, which are usually reconstituted from dried peas.
- After testing several similar recipes for broccoli salad, we noticed a big difference in flavor when the florets were cut into smaller pieces, which allows the dressing to evenly coat the ingredients rather than pool at the bottom of the bowl.
- Naturally crisp and sweet, broccoli stems add a delicious counterpoint to the florets. When making salads, cut the florets from the stem, and separate florets into small pieces using the tip of a paring knife. Peel away the tough outer layer of the stems, and finely chop, or cut into 1-inch pieces and pulse several times in food processor.
