The meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM at the home of Phil Gerber.

A motion was made by NSA President Denise Larbig to approve the minutes from the August 3, 2010 meeting. Motion approved by Rick Watts, seconded by Lois Warner. All were in favor, motion carried.

**Membership:** Philip Gerber reported that 3 new members paid their dues, bringing our total to 140, one more than last year!

**Pier:** Denise Larbig submitted Brian Ferguson’s report as follows:  
 The Pier Committee has not yet met, but Brian and Denise Larbig have been gathering rules and regulations from marinas around the country as a basis for revising North Shore’s marina contracts.

Anne Arundel County will not issue new permit for the pier repair until all old permits are closed out. Currently the electric is not up to code and three permits were never closed out. It will be several thousand dollars to get the electric up to code.

There are a total of 3 outstanding expired permits that need to be closed before a new permit can be pulled.

Brian is in process of exploring the process of closing out the expired permits and applying for a new permit.

**Roads and Zoning:** Lois Warner reported the following people have applied/asked for the board’s approval on the following work:

Jeff Schell of Park Creek Court: Live tree removal and railroad wall replacement. Denise Larbig, the adjacent neighbor, approved his proposal, pending application of paperwork.

Glenn Hannon of Edgewater Road: Dead tree removal

Denise Larbig of Park Creek Court: Dead tree removal

Rick Watts motioned to allow the above requests once the applications have been submitted to Lois Warner. Seconded by Lois Warner. All in favor and the motion passed. Sarah Anne Parsons, acting as representative for the Larson property, noted that the Larson property needs major repair of a retaining wall. As this is an existing wall, the board determined that the Larsons do not need to apply for approval from the NS Board.

**Beach:** Rick Watts reported the beach was vandalized on August 28 between 11:30am and 5pm. There was no permanent damage. Anyone with information regarding the damage should contact Rick.

Rick Watts reminds beach renters that they need to remove all trash, park on one side, and honor the 11pm curfew.

At the October 5 Board meeting the board will vote on a proposal that the fees for renting the beach be \$100 for larger parties. They will also consider the option of charging a deposit to cover damages and leftover trash removal. *Please contact your board member with any thoughts or suggestions regarding the changes on beach rental.*

Rick will need volunteers for removal of nettle nets at the end of September.

**Park:** Park is fine.

**Entertainment:** Jennifer reported that the numbers look good for the Crab Feast. Lois needs Crab Feast volunteers for grilling, 50/50 raffle, games, ticket table, etc. Folding tables and chairs would be appreciated. Tents to arrive Friday, volunteers needed to assist with setup Saturday at 8am.

**Garden Club:** The Garden Club is requesting the North Shore Association commit some funds for the plantings of the New Sign garden and other areas. Denise requested that the Garden Club submit a budget next year. Sarah Anne requested \$200-300 for the plants for this year. Bonnie motioned to allow the expense, Lois seconded. All approved, motion carried. Christmas house tour party will be December 10. The new sign will need updated wiring.

Denise is trying to retrieve the balance of the winter dinner dance deposit from the Maryland Yacht Club. Sarah Anne will go to the club, say that the Garden Club is in agreement with the board and would like the \$250 deposit reimbursed.

**Welcome:** No Report.

**Greater Pasadena Council:** Robin reported that there was no council meeting in July or August. The next meeting is the last Tuesday of September.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

In regard to the Looper ball fields safety/traffic issue, Denise Larbig reports that the Panthers have moved the majority of games to Chesapeake High School. Jennifer King elaborated that the Police conducted a survey and determined that the traffic during game-time was hazardous and as a result, the Panther team has moved all football games to Chesapeake High School. Except for a few tiny

tykes football games the majority of football games are no longer at Looper Fields. The traffic should be much reduced. This news was greeted with applause from the board.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Bonnie Howatt noted that our community real estate taxes are due and they have decreased. They went down from \$309 to \$273 at the Park. Right of Way went from \$48 to \$34 and the Open Space went from \$252 to \$170.

Sarah Anne proposed that we have a community yard sale at the beach. She will schedule the event for some weekend in October. Dumpster has yet to be scheduled.

Please note that the community has suffered from numerous petty thefts, and the more serious crime of a stolen car. Please lock up your cars. The Police know about this, but all neighbors need to take the time to note the license plate number and details of any suspicious cars.

Lois Warner recommended that the board come up with ideas for fundraisers such as a 5 K fun run or a fishing tournament.

There will be a Community Yard sale at the Beach Sat, Oct 16<sup>th</sup>. All are welcomed to join. Call Jen Harris or Meg Ferguson for details.

Next meeting scheduled for Tuesday, October 5, 2010, at the home of Rae Regula to be held at 7pm.

Denise Larbig adjourned the meeting at 8:30 PM.

## Food COME ON OVER

Why settle for a plain old chop or tenderloin when you can enjoy one of these creative choices? Slow-cooked Honey-Soy Appetizer Ribs take some effort, but the results are meltingly tender and rich. You'll find most of the ingredients in your pantry. By **Donna Florio**

Cook Honey-Soy Appetizer Ribs on the grill for finger-licking goodness.



## Pork With Pizzazz

### Honey-Soy Appetizer Ribs

**MAKES 8 APPETIZER SERVINGS;**  
**PREP:** 15 MIN.; **COOK:** 30 MIN.; **GRILL:** 1 HR., 45 MIN.; **STAND:** 10 MIN.

*Have the butcher cut the ribs in half crosswise to make appetizer-size ribs. You can prepare the ribs through Step 2 the day before you plan to cook them. Cover and chill overnight. You may need to grill the ribs a little longer to compensate for the fact that they are cold.*

- 2 slabs pork spareribs (about 4 lb.)
- 1 cup honey
- 1/2 cup soy sauce
- 3 Tbsp. sherry (optional)
- 2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. dried crushed red pepper
- Garnishes: sesame seeds, thinly sliced green onions
- Quick Asian Barbecue Sauce (optional)

1. Rinse and pat ribs dry. If desired, remove thin membrane from back of ribs by slicing into it with a knife and then pulling it off. (This will make ribs more tender.)
2. Bring ribs and water to cover to a boil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high heat; reduce heat to medium, and simmer 30 minutes. Drain and pat dry. Place ribs in a 13- x 9-inch baking dish.
3. Stir together honey and next 4 ingredients; pour over ribs.
4. Light 1 side of grill, heating to 350° to 400° (medium-high) heat; leave other side unlit. Arrange ribs over unlit side of grill, reserving sauce in dish. Grill, covered with grill lid, 45 minutes. Reposition rib slabs, placing slab closest to heat source away

from heat and moving other slab closer to heat. Grill, covered with grill lid, 45 minutes to 1 hour or until tender, repositioning ribs and basting with reserved sauce every 20 minutes. Remove ribs from grill, and let stand 10 minutes. Cut ribs, slicing between bones. Garnish, if desired. Serve with Quick Asian Barbecue Sauce, if desired.

### Quick Asian Barbecue Sauce

**MAKES 1/2 CUP; PREP:** 5 MIN.  
Stir together 1/2 cup barbecue sauce, 2 Tbsp. soy sauce, and 1 tsp. Asian sriracha hot chili sauce.

### Pork-and-Pasta With Gorgonzola Cream

**MAKES 4 SERVINGS; PREP:** 20 MIN., **COOK:** 9 MIN.

- 1 (1-lb.) pork tenderloin
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. dried oregano
- 1/2 tsp. dried basil
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 (12-oz.) package fettuccine
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. balsamic vinegar
- Gorgonzola Cream

1. Remove silver skin from tenderloin, leaving a thin layer of fat. Cut pork into 8 (3/4-inch) medallions. Combine salt and next 4 ingredients. Sprinkle medallions with salt mixture.
2. Prepare pasta according to package directions.

3. Meanwhile, melt butter in a large non-stick skillet over medium-high heat; add medallions, and cook 2 to 3 minutes on each side or until lightly browned. Reduce heat to medium; stir in vinegar. Cook pork 1 to 1 1/2 minutes on each side or until meat is done. Serve medallions over hot cooked pasta with Gorgonzola Cream.

### Gorgonzola Cream:

**MAKES ABOUT 1 1/2 CUPS; PREP:** 5 MIN., **COOK:** 5 MIN.  
Melt 2 Tbsp. butter in a small skillet over low heat; stir in 1 cup half-and-half and 1/2 cup crumbled Gorgonzola cheese, stirring until cheese is melted.
