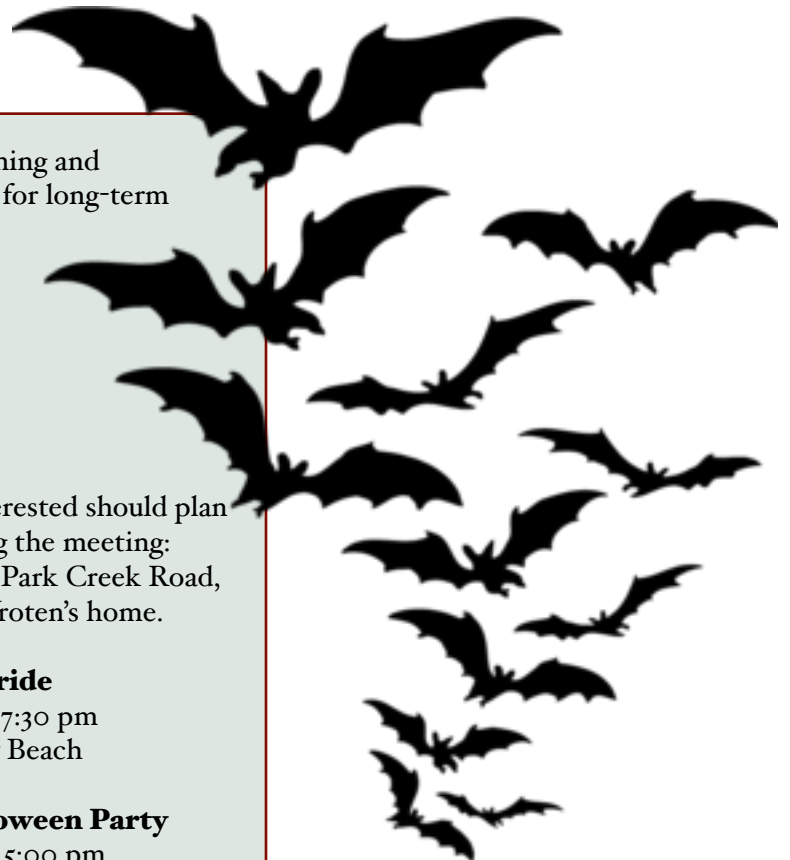

**MINUTES FOR NORTH SHORE
ASSOCIATION**

Board Members Present: Jennifer King, Wayne Bartholomee, Ted Tepper, Bonnie Howatt, Jennifer Harris, Rae Regula, Brenda DeRemer, Sarah Ann Parsons, Roberta Watts

Guests: Tiki Poist, Michelle Hernandez, Carl Kuhne, and Carolyn Decker

The meeting was called to order at 7:10PM at the home of Roberta Watts.

Jennifer King moved to approve the minutes from September 4, 2012. Motion approved by Rae Regula, seconded by Jennifer Harris. All were in favor, motion carried.

The Board welcomed the visiting guests and invited new resident Michelle Hernandez to be a member of North Shore on the Magothy.

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:

Treasurer: Bonnie Howatt reported that the General Fund started with \$21,340. She had \$2,570 in receipts and \$2,496 in expenses. The month closed with \$21,415 in the General Fund and \$15,650 in the Capital Fund. *See the Treasurer's full report on the website www.Northshoreaa.com. Thank you.*

Beach: Jennifer King and Ted Tepper reported that the beach has been mown, there are no new rentals this month, and the nettle net needs to be removed. This will happen during clean-up day, Saturday, October 13. Volunteers are needed.

The dumpsters are confirmed to arrive October 17-19. Jennifer will put the list of prohibited items in *the Barnacle*.

Carl Kuhne asked about the pavilion, and expressed concern that it would not survive the next nor-easter. He did some research and notes that Ed Barrett probably built it using old phone poles. Ted mentioned that the poles are sunk into 3' of concrete. The board agreed that a temporary fix is needed for the far corner (closest to Tepper pier) and that the hollow tree leaning over the pavilion needs to be removed. Wayne Bartholomee will get estimates for the tree removal. *Bonnie Howatt motioned that the board budget \$150 towards the purchase of two lally columns (adjustable metal poles) to be purchased and installed by Ted Tepper at the North East corner of the pavilion. Roberta Watts seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion carried.*

The board decided to send a community-wide letter noting that the pavilion will need major repairs and that the community will need to vote on the additional expense at the February meeting.

Entertainment: Jennifer Harris reported that the crab feast was a success and thanks Carl Kuhne and Denny Debus for all of their help ordering and supplying the crabs and also to Dean Hildebrande for taking care of the crab feast trash. Also, thank you to Carl Kuhne, Denny Debus, Charlie and Sarah Ann Parsons, Sean Harris, Richard and Rae Regula, Bonnie Howatt, Brian Ferguson, Clara Bartholomee, Mike and Lois Warner, and Wendy Warner for their help setting up and cleaning up.

There were about 85 people in attendance, and the event raised over \$500 for the community.

Carl Kuhne and Jennifer Harris made a few suggestions to improve the crab feast next year: Supply only chicken and crab (no burgers/dogs), coincide with clean-up day, note end-time for all you can eat crabs, mix mediums and large crabs, check price of crabs before

setting ticket prices, eliminate non-crab ticket, have the board call all members a month in advance to increase attendance and get better head-count. The board agreed that the Crab Feast should be the Saturday after Labor Day. Rae Regula suggested that it be combined with the Luau.

Jennifer Harris then set dates/times for fall events: Adult hayride is 10/27 at 7:30PM; kid Halloween party is 10/28 at 5PM (pizza, games, campfire). Halloween trick or treat on Wednesday 10/31.

Thanks to the Mosquito Squad for donating their time and materials spraying the community beach before the Crab Feast and keeping us mosquito free!

Garden Club: Sarah Ann Parsons reported the following: the Garden Club met at Rae Regula's home and enjoyed a presentation by Himmel's coworkers Brenda Pearson and Dottie Snyder regarding fall plants and winter garden prep.

The cookbook is being published and pre-sales are going well. Thanks to Jennifer Harris for all the hard work and organization she put in to getting the book ready. Her help is certainly appreciated. Note: discounted cookbook price is \$12.50 through October 15. Afterwards, the North Shore cookbook's price is \$15.

Pier: Ted Tepper reported that he has numbered all the slips at the marina with the help of Dean Hildebrand. He would like to locate the ice-eaters and schedule draining the water pipes during October 13th's clean up day.

Roads and Zoning: Wayne Bartholomee reported that the Vandegaers have filed paperwork for improvements to their home at 427 Auds Lane. *Wayne motioned that the board approves the Vandegaer's request for the renovation at 427 Auds Lane. Ted Tepper seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion passed.*

Wayne noted that the resident who had applied for tree removal last month was Donna Hawley at 375 Dutchship Road.

The purchaser of 353 Edgewater Road has contacted Wayne Bartholomee about North Shore on the Magothy regulations for new construction at that site.

Ted Alfriend of 378 Dutchship Road filed papers for the renovation of a 5' x 12' entry. *Wayne motioned that the board approves the Alfriend's request for the renovation 378 Dutchship Road. Jennifer King approved the motion and*

Jennifer Harris seconded. All were in favor, motion passed.

***Neighbors are reminded that it is their responsibility to read the covenants and be sure they are in compliance. Otherwise they could receive a visit from a member of the North Shore on the Magothy Board and follow-up legal action as necessary. ***

Wayne Bartholomee asks that those submitting paperwork for construction/improvement/tree removal do so at least 10 days before the first Tuesday of the month when he must file a report with the Board.

Welcome: Brenda DeRemer welcomed a neighbor at North Shore Road, and received the names/addresses of several new residents that she will contact this month.

NEW BUSINESS: Roberta Watts received an email from Robin Saylor requesting help in cleaning North Shore Road. "...Our neighborhood is getting pretty bad again and if anyone has time during the week to go up and down the road with me a morning or afternoon in the month of October call me. Can't do weekends. Rae Regula mentioned that she is contacting the county about having North Shore on the Magothy "adopt" North Shore road.

Roberta Watts motioned that Wayne Bartholomee step in as Vice President for the duration of the term, relieving Marty Gavin of his post. Jennifer King seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion passed.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 6, 2012 at the home of Wayne Bartholomee at 7PM.

Jennifer King motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:50 PM. Roberta Watts seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.
