**MINUTES FOR NORTH SHORE  
ASSOCIATION**

**Board Members Present:** Rae Regula, Marty Gavin, Roberta Watts, Jennifer King, Phil Gerber, Amy Bartholomee, Wayne Bartholomee, Bonnie Howatt, Brenda DeRemer, Robyn Gearhart-Sayler, Ted Tepper

The meeting was called to order at 7:25PM at the home of Bonnie Howatt.

*Marty Gavin moved to approve the minutes from March 6, 2012. Motion seconded by Rae Regula. All were in favor, motion carried.*

**BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:**

**Treasurer:** Bonnie Howatt reported that we started with \$10,214 and ended the month with \$12,145. The Capital Fund is \$15,603. See the Treasurer's full report on the website [www.Northshoreaa.com](http://www.Northshoreaa.com). Thank you.

**Membership:** Phil Gerber reported that he sent out North Shore membership notices yesterday and they are due by May 20, 2012. Please note that membership must be paid for use of the North Shore facilities as well as for slip rentals. **Pier:** Ted Tepper reported that he has started to receive slip fees from the renewal notices that Brian Ferguson sent out last month. North Shore on the Magothy membership must be current to rent boat slips at the North Shore marina.

**Roads and Zoning:** Wayne Bartholomee reported that residents on Auds lane have applied to the county for permits for work on their home. He hopes to have their North Shore Property Improvement paperwork at the next meeting.

A neighbor on Park Creek Court inquired about needing Property Improvement forms for replacing the existing handrail for a deck. The board concurred that the owner did not need to submit paperwork for *replacing an existing* deck/handrail with a new deck/handrail.

**Beach:** Marty Gavin reported that he has received one reservation for the Beach rental and several requests. Anyone interested in renting the beach should contact Marty as dates do fill up.

The annual sock burning party was a great success.

The health department has contacted Marty about water quality testing and he has requested that they monitor the water quality at North Shore's community beach again this year.

He is still waiting to receive the estimates for replacing the eaves of the pavilion. Marty will be looking into competitive pricing for spot-a-pots.

Thanks to Ted Tepper for cleaning up the beach!

**Park:** Rae Regula reported that she and Jim Logan met at the North Shore park and he will help with mulch and storm water management ideas. Rae mentioned that the trashcan at the woods was overflowing. Roberta Watts recommended that they move it to an area where the county waste management service can remove the trash

weekly. Roberta asked about the mulch that has already seeped into the storm drains, and several members remarked that the county should be contacted to clean out all storm drains, including those not at the curb. Wayne Bartholomee proposed contacting Derek Fink but recommended that we have a map showing all storm drains so that the county has the correct information. Phil Gerber offered to call Derek Fink once he receives a list/map of the storm drains in the neighborhood.

Rae Regula mentioned that community clean up day is coming, and would like to get a dumpster to hold the yard waste from the North Shore park and the stream bed at the east end of Valley Road. There was a discussion about how to get more people in the neighborhood to volunteer for clean-up days, including raising dues and boat fees to cover extra labor costs. Jennifer King recommended that we think on it and discuss it at next month's meeting.

There was some vandalism of the new play equipment at the park. Marty Gavin reminded everyone that the new hours at the Beach and the Park are dawn to dusk.

**Entertainment:** Jennifer King reported for Jennifer Harris that the Easter Egg Hung flyer was distributed, the Progressive Dinner is May 19<sup>th</sup> (with boats and starting at the Logan's). Please contact Jennifer King with ideas/reservations for the Progressive Dinner.

**Welcome:** Brenda DeRemer reported that she is in the process of welcoming two newcomer families to the neighborhood.

**Garden Club:** No Report. Roberta Watts mentioned that the last meeting was hosted at Jean Brush's home. It was well attended and guest speakers Dottie and Brenda from

Himmel's gave much needed advice on lawn and garden management and care. The next Garden Club meeting will be on April 17<sup>th</sup> at Jennifer Harris' home on Edgewater Road. All are welcome to come, 7PM. Many thanks to all Garden Club members and especially to Cris and Robyn for all their hard work on the garden at North Shore's entry!

**Greater Pasadena Council:** Robyn Gearhart-Sayler reported that the GPC is meeting with their lawyer about dissolving the GPC.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- The Gazette article on the cancellation of the bumper bash was presented to the board.
- Bonnie Howatt requested that the board members update their information for the North Shore board of Governor's roster.
- Jennifer King brought up the lawn mowing expense and the need for kids in the neighborhood to get work. Ted Tepper offered to take care of the grassy area at the North Shore beach, Marty Gavin offered to weed-whack the Mountain Road sign area and Jennifer King will schedule teen mowing for the community park.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Carter Howatt remarked that there should be no motorized vehicles on community property as there is a safety and liability issue.
- Marty Gavin recommended that North Shore invite the Eastern District's Crime Department to send someone to a board meeting.
- Brenda DeRemer informed the board that she has plantings scheduled this week on her property.

*Marty Gavin motioned to adjourn the meeting at 9:10PM. Phil Gerber seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.*

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
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
