MINUTES FOR NORTH SHORE ASSOCIATION

Board Members Present: Marty Gavin, Phil Gerber, Bonnie Howatt, Sarah Ann Parsons, Robin Gearhart-Sayler, Rae Regula, Jennifer Harris, Amy Bartholomee, Wayne Bartholomee, Jennifer King

Guests: Brian Ferguson, Milt Ordakowski, Nick Briggs, Andrea Briggs

Marty Gavin introduced Milt Ordakowski of Tiffany Builders to discuss the condition of the North Shore Beach pavilion. Milt noted that the quick fix of repairing and re-shingling the eaves of the pavilion would cost \$1000. However, he noted that several of the supports were sinking or getting damaged by water, causing the roof to sag. The quick fix would be to raise the roof by supporting it where the pilings meet the roof. However, he recommends rebuilding the structure, replacing it "in kind" with new trusses and roof that would span the entire footprint. He would also replace the pilings. Unsure of the costs, he estimates it would be in the \$20,000- \$30,000. The board thanked Milt for coming and reporting on the pavilion.

The meeting was called to order at 7:25 PM at the home of Robin Gearhart-Sayler. *Marty Gavin moved to approve the minutes from May 1, 2012. Motion approved by Rae Regula, seconded by Sarah Ann Parsons. All were in favor, motion carried.*

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:

Treasurer: Bonnie Howatt reported that receipts from membership and pier totaled \$6500 and expenses were \$516 leaving a new

balance of \$ 23,656 in the General Fund and \$15,612 in the Capital Fund. *See the Treasurer's full report on the website www.Northshoreaa.com. Thank you.*

Membership: Phil Gerber reported that North Shore has 114 paid members so far. He will post a second notice later this month. He was happy to report \$490 in donations. Thank you North Shore members! Please note that membership must be paid to use the North Shore Community facilities and rent the beach.

Park: Rae Regula reported that the new trash can has been put in place at the NS Park near the road for trash pick-up. She also reported the "rocking" horse has finally broken from its support and has been removed. Grass cutting is going well and all equipment is in good repair. She is considering letting the mulched area at the play area that is not under equipment go "green".

Beach: Marty Gavin reported that John Stopowski and his company, Absolute Signs, have replaced the No Trespassing sign at the community beach. Thank you John Stopowski for all that you do for North Shore. Marty also thanks Harry and Jerri Rupperecht for their work on "repairing" the North Shore Beach bench. What started as a repair quickly turned into an entirely new bench with increased structural support. Thanks again, Rupperechts! Marty also replaced the lock at the shed. He is getting new burners for the grill (which is available to those who rent the beach and bring their own propane). Finally, he would like to thank the following for all their help at the Beach Cleanup Day on May 12: Ted Tepper, Tyler Larbig, Doug Freeman, Wayne Watters, Graham Dougan, Matthew Dougan, Rae Regula, Carolyn Decker, Bill Schoonmaker,

Robin Sayler, Harry Rupprecht, Jerri Rupprecht, Jen King, Jen Harris, Richard Regula, and Wayne Bartholomee.

Marty Gavin introduced neighbors Nick and Andrea Briggs who have gained approval from the county for a fence on their lot. They also paid their membership.

Roads and Zoning: Wayne Bartholomee reported that the NS Board approved Heidi Cross' application, the DeRemer application and the tree removal application on Dutchship Court.

New applications were submitted for 377 Edgewater Road, 370 Dutchship Road and 363 Dutchship Court.

Wayne Bartholomee motioned that we approve the home improvements for 377 Edgewater Road. Phil Gerber seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Wayne Bartholomee motioned that we approve the tree removal at 370 Dutchship Road. Roberta Watts seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Wayne Bartholomee motioned that we approve the tree removal for 363 Dutchship Court. Roberta Watts seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Rae and Richard Regula of 413 Park Creek Court have applied for deck replacement.

Wayne Bartholomee motioned that we approve the Regula's application. Bonnie Howatt seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Wayne reminds the neighborhood that all fencing and construction on covenant properties need to be approved by the North Shore board as well as Anne Arundel County.

Pier: Brian Ferguson reported for Ted Tepper that there are no issues at the pier other than the ongoing concern with updating the electric and getting it up to code. He is working on transferring the permit to another electrician, and getting the site inspected to determine the scope of work necessary to get the pier electricity up to code.

Entertainment: Jennifer Harris reported that Family Day was well attended with approximately 70 people, some of whom stayed until the event curfew! It came in under budget.

Next event is Fourth of July. The banner will be cleaned/replaced for this event and Bob Douglas will conduct the annual wade-in for water clarity. Remember to meet at Dutchship Court and Dutchship Road for the 10AM parade to the beach.

After much negotiation, the Crab Feast is scheduled for September 22, 2012.

Welcome: No Report

Garden Club: Sarah Ann Parsons would like to thank the garden club members for continued maintenance. Thanks to Rae Regula who raised \$125 for the Garden Club from a plant sale she hosted. The next Garden Club meeting will be the Luau planning meeting at the Community Beach on Tuesday June 20th. Note that we will be meeting earlier, at 6:30PM.

Greater Pasadena Council: Robin Gearhart-Sayler reported that the GPC will be

meeting on June 5th. [Robin has since attended the June GPC meeting and reports that they will send a letter to each and every community in Pasadena that held a GPC membership. The content of the June 5, 2012 letter details the original purpose of the GPC and how the participation in the GPC has dwindled as "... Our present elected officials are in close contact with our individual communities and there are no major problems requiring the input of all our members." Their other obligation was maintaining the American flag at Mountain Road. "The [Pasadena Business Association] is willing to take over responsibility for the flag. They also plan to make significant improvements to the area surrounding the flag. The GPC presently has a balance of \$13,614 in our regular account. I [Joseph A. Foran, treasurer] recommend that we transfer both funds [their current flag fund and the general fund] to the PBA in an account they establish for the improvements as well as the purchase and maintenance of future flags." Any North Shore member with questions should contact Robin Gearhart-Sayler.

OLD BUSINESS:

Jennifer King reminded the board that Friday cocktails at the NS Beach are scheduled on June 15, 22 and 29 if the beach is available. This is a BYOB, TYOT event (bring your own bottle, *take your own trash*). This is a great way to meet new neighbors, and all North Shore members are invited. Not a paid member? Come with checkbook and join in the fun!

Phil Gerber has received civil plans for the North Shore on the Magothy that indicate locations of drainage and culverts. He will do a survey of the neighborhood, highlighting the drains that need clearing and send the final request to Delegate Fink's office who will then send in a work order. Thank you Phil for taking charge!

NEW BUSINESS:

Jennifer King reported that the dumpsters will be at the neighborhood beach from October 17-19th.

Jennifer King has forwarded a letter to the Barnacle from Delegate Nic Kipke concerning a traffic light at North Shore road.

Roberta Watts reminded the board that trash pickup has been reduced to one day a week. All trash/recycling/yard waste to be hauled on Fridays. Roberta Watts questioned how we could switch pickup to an earlier weekday out of concern for the stink/buildup of trash from weekend events (esp. with Friday holidays). She will contact Steve Schuh's office.

The next meeting is scheduled for MONDAY July 2, 2012 at the home of Wayne and Amy Bartholomee at 7PM.

Jennifer King motioned to adjourn the meeting at 9:00PM. Rae Regula seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Dallas Butts graduated from Mount Saint Joseph High School on June 3.

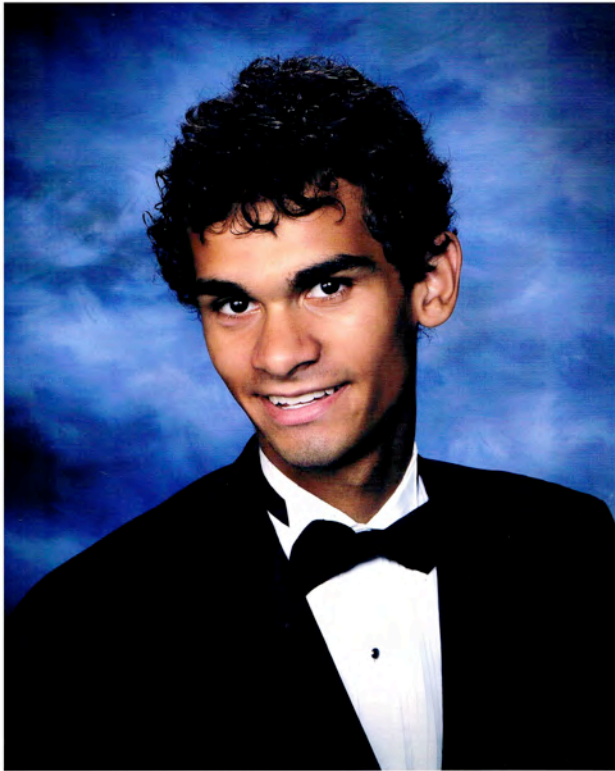
KENDALL MARONE PARROTT

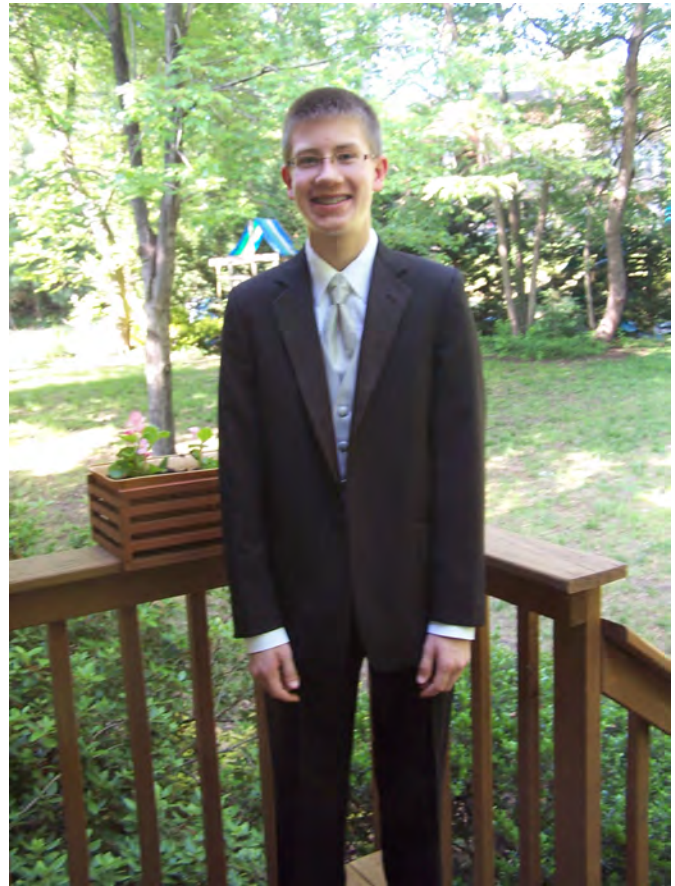


AUSTIN MURDOCK

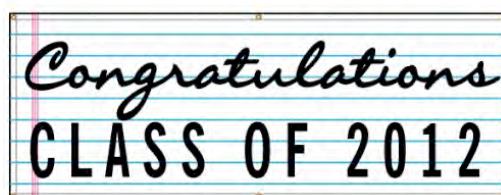

Summer Berry Trifle

Serving this traditional English dessert in a glass pedestal bowl shows off its impressive layers of ladyfingers, pudding, and colorful fruits. If you don't have one, a regular glass bowl will also do the trick.

Ingredients

- 1 package (3.4-ounce) instant vanilla pudding
- 4 cups fresh berries (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, or blackberries), washed and hulled, plus extra for garnish
- 1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 24 to 36 ladyfingers

Instructions

1. To make the fillings, prepare the pudding according to the package directions and chill it.
2. Slice the strawberries, if you're using them, then toss all of the berries with the lemon juice and the 1/4 cup of sugar. Set aside for 30 minutes to allow the berries to release their juices.
3. In a medium mixing bowl, whip the cream, vanilla extract, and remaining 2 tablespoons of sugar until soft peaks form. Set aside.
4. To make the layers, set a layer of ladyfingers (around 7 or 8) on the bottom of a large, clear serving bowl (ours was 4 quarts). Top with the berries with half of the pudding.
5. Add another layer of ladyfingers, another third of the berries and juice, and the rest of the pudding. Add a final layer of ladyfingers and berries. Top with the whipped cream and a berry garnish.
6. Refrigerate until you're ready to serve. Serves 8 to 10.

The State Highway Administration continues to refuse to approve a traffic signal despite my requests to look at the problem. Please let residents in North Shore know that they can formally request a traffic light through this link: http://marylandsha.force.com/customercare/request_for_service. The more people who direct their concerns to the SHA the more attention the issue will receive from their traffic engineers.

A small victory: The street light that illuminates the intersection at MD177 & North Shore Rd is going to be replaced. I asked [A.A.Co.](#) to replace this light with a much brighter light to improve visibility at night. They agreed to do so and will be installing a much brighter light in the near future.
