Dear North Shore Neighbor:

Plans are underway for the annual membership meeting for North Shore Community Association in February. We wanted to bring to your attention an issue which will be on the meeting agenda and slated for membership vote.

The issue concerns the placement of sheds, garages and other outbuildings of any kind whatsoever on residential property. Presently, Anne Arundel County requires that sheds, garages and other outbuildings of any kind whatsoever be located at least seven feet from the property line. The North Shore Community Restrictive Covenants require a ten foot setback. Noting that this more restrictive standard has not been consistently enforced over the years, and believing that the Anne Arundel County standard adequately meets the intent and purposes of the restrictive covenant, the Board would like to conform its enforcement policies to that of Anne Arundel County.

With that objective in mind, the following proposal will be the subject of discussion and vote at the annual meeting:

Noting that Anne Arundel County presently requires sheds, garages and other outbuildings of any kind whatsoever to be located at least seven feet from any property line, it is proposed that the Board of Directors be authorized to approve applications for sheds which comply with the county set-back requirements, notwithstanding the more stringent standard which is established in the North Shore Restrictive Covenants.

It is further proposed that the Board of Directors refrain from any actions to enforce compliance with the more stringent set-back established by the North Shore Restrictive Covenants.

We hope to see you at the Annual Meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 7:25PM at the home of Jennifer Harris.

Jennifer King moved to approve the minutes from December 4th. Motion seconded by Wayne Bartholomee. All were in favor, motion carried.

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:

Jennifer King opened the meeting by inviting guests Andrea and Nick Briggs to speak. They expressed concern about rumors and wish to come forward to clear their name. Elaine Disney Clark, born May 25, 1924 in Hanover, MD.

She had a happy childhood and graduated from Glen Burnie High School in 1941. Elaine's family moved to a house on Camp Meade Road in which her future husband, Thomas Clark, was born. It happened to be across the road from where Thomas' family moved. They kidded each other that they got together in the early years of WWII because of gasoline rationing, but it was really true love. They were married on October 4, 1945 in Friendship United Methodist Church when Thomas returned from the war in Europe.

This church was later removed when the airport took over the land and they helped establish the new Wesley Grove United Methodist Church on Dorsey Rd., using the stained glass windows and other fixtures from

the Friendship Church. When Thomas and Elaine moved to Linthicum they again became involved with the construction and establishment of the New Linthicum United Methodist Church which was built across the street from their home. Since moving to Pasadena in 1963, they have been members of Magothy United Methodist Church.

Elaine and Thomas have enjoyed 67 wonderful years of marriage and raised 4 children. Elaine worked for the C&P Telephone Company for several years before the first child was born in 1947, then she dedicated her life as a wife, a mother and a homemaker.

She is preceded in death by one daughter, Diane Clark, her parents, Arthur & Jennie Disney, one sister and five brothers. She is also preceded by her grandson, Thomas Clark, IV.

Elaine is survived by her husband, Thomas Clark, Jr., one son, Thomas Clark, III & his wife Christine, two daughters, Patricia Krehnbrink & her husband Thomas, and Cynthia Parker and her husband Thomas.

She also leaves behind 8 grandchildren, 13 great grandchildren, with one more on the way and 1 great great grandchild. Elaine loved reading, sewing, boating, gardening, and traveling. She also enjoyed working on cross-stitching and made personalized Christmas ornaments every year for her children and grandchildren. She loved participating in family events and having her family around.

After a long and full life of 88 years, Elaine was honored to go home on December 9, 2012, with God whom she loved very much.

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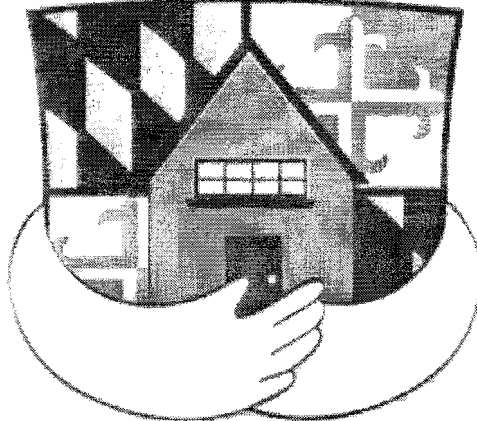

Bulk Items Needed:

- Pop-top cans of fruit and pop-top cans of canned meats (i.e. Vienna Sausages)
- Tuna Kits (w/ crackers, packaged tuna, and plastic utensils)
- Granola bars, Pop Tarts, individual size juice and milk boxes (non-perishable)
- Cheese or peanut butter crackers
- Small packages of crackers
- Non-refrigerated pudding cups
- Small boxes of cereal that become their own bowls
- 8oz bottles of water
- Plastic eating utensils
- Individual wipes
- Tube socks (men and women's sizes)
- Underwear (men or women)
- New blankets (adult and baby)
