

Minutes of the
North Shore Board of Governors
Meeting
April 2, 2013

The monthly meeting of the North Shore Board of Governors was held on April 2, 2013 at the home of Rae Regula. In attendance were: Wayne Bartholomee, Rae Regula, Bonnie Howatt, Lana Matovcik, Ted Tepper, Jeff Schell, Jen Harris, Sarah Ann Parsons, Rick Scruggs, Mike Davis, and Carl Kuhne.

Treasurer's Report

Current Balances are as follows:

General Fund	\$ 15,119.00
Capital Fund	\$ 15,692.00

There was no new revenue to report for the month, and ordinary expenses totaled \$356.00.

Beach

The rental terms for reserving the Beach will remain the same this year. If North Shore members would like to rent the beach and Pavilion for their event, the rental rates are \$50.00 for events with up to 50 attendants, and \$100.00 for larger gatherings. Anyone renting the facility is required to clean up after the event and remove all trash. A refundable security deposit of \$100 is required. Note that the beach rental is non-exclusive, and North Shore members are permitted to use the beach area during the event.

The beach has been reserved for June 28 by Ted Tepper.

Pier

In accordance with the decision of the Members at the annual meeting, beginning

this year, the fee for a ramp key will be \$25.00 per year. Jeff will be sending invoices to current key-holders for renewal, as well as renewal fees for slip rental. Note that payment of these fees is invalid without payment of membership dues for the year.

Jeff noted that there are ongoing normal maintenance and repairs to be done at the pier. He has replaced a few deck boards from left-over lumber, and the Board authorized him to incur minor expenses for these repairs without obtaining board approval for each item. It was noted that the North Shore members who have slips at the marina are getting a significant bargain, and in light of that, should take some ownership of the situation and undertake their own minor repairs to the extent it is safe and feasible to do so. Electric service continues to have some minor issues with a GFI that needs replaced which Jeff will follow up on.

Entertainment

Jennifer Harris noted that the Easter Egg Hunt was poorly attended, with only 11 children participating, but they all enjoyed the festivities and collected LOTS of eggs! Thanks to Rae Regula, Sarah Ann and Charlie Parsons for helping with the event.

The next event is Family Day, scheduled for Saturday, June 1. Bring a dish to share. Beer, Burgers and Hot Dogs will be provided.

Garden Club

Sadly, the Dance has been cancelled, due to poor ticket sales. Kurtz's is graciously refunding the deposit of \$500.00, although not required to do so. The next scheduled social event is the Luau which is slated for July 26. Next meeting is scheduled for April 16th. See details in the garden club report.

Membership – no report.

Park

It was decided to have Cody Schell do the mowing again this year, on an as needed basis, which includes extensive trimming around the playground equipment. He will also mow the Beach area. Generally, it is anticipated that mowing will be required every two weeks, but could be more frequently, depending on weather.

We will be ordering the porta-potties this month. The Board notes that there is a continuing issue regarding the mulch needed under the playground equipment, and the need to keep the drain covers free from obstruction. Rick noted that some minor repairs need to be made to the equipment which he is taking care of. He will set up a work party if more significant issue arise.

Roads & Zoning

Richard and Marion Brumbach submitted plans for 353 Edgewater Road, including new pier and bulkhead, and demolition and new residential construction. Upon motion of Mike Davis, the plans were unanimously approved by the Board, conditioned upon approval and issuance of all required permits by the appropriate governmental agencies.

The Board is looking into whether anything can be done to alleviate the muddy eyesore at the intersection of North Shore Road and Mountain Road. The consensus is that the property is owned by the County, but it is possible that it is owned by the Looper family. We will continue to look into the matter.

Welcome - No report.

Old Business

Plans are underway to begin raising funds for the repairs/remodeling needed at the beach Pavilion. Our goal is to raise as much as \$30,000 for this purpose. The County has indicated that if we wanted to demolish the structure and start anew, it is unlikely that permits would be issued to replace the Pavilion as is. Therefore, at this point, we are proceeding with the expectation that we will shore up the existing structure and reconfigure a new roof to cover the entire area. John Williams will initiate a capital campaign for this purpose. Members are encouraged to submit contributions along with membership dues for the year and we plan to have a line item on the membership renewal form to designate the contribution amount. Ted will talk with the contractor and bring more detailed proposals to next month's meeting. Time is of the essence for this project and the Board is determined to get this project completed for this season's use.

New Business

In accordance with the discussions at the annual meeting, upon motion by Lana Matovcik, seconded by Mike Davis, the Board voted unanimously to modify its enforcement of setbacks to conform to those required by Anne Arundel County.

Mosquito spraying – It was noted that Mosquito Squad offers discounted rates to North Shore homeowners, and also graciously offers free spraying of our beach and park for community events. You can reach them at 877-667-0823.

The Board reminds everyone that with warmer weather on the way, please use extra care to watch for children playing along the streets and please go SLOW around those blind turns and intersections.

Next month's meeting will be held on May 7 at the home of Bonnie Howatt.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 pm.

Dear NORTH SHORE Neighbor,

The NORTH SHORE Board of Directors has asked me to spear head a campaign to raise funds for the renovation of the Beach Pavilion, and the Marina Shed. The Board stretches the \$50/\$100 dues as far as they can, however, it doesn't cover the major improvements that are needed at this time. The Buzz Gant designed Pavilion and the Marina Shed are structurally unsound and need to be renovated.

The current Pavilion is over 40 years old and has seen better days. The Pavilion's rotting roof needs to be replaced, and the failing support columns need to be stabilized. There are very few people in NORTH SHORE that haven't received benefit from the Pavilion.



The Pavilion is touched by the Crab Feast, 4th of July parade, Halloween party, Easter Egg Hunt, Family Day and many functions used by NORTH SHORE citizenry. There have been weddings, family reunions, high school graduation parties and other events over the years. And it still is a great place to have a summer swim!

The Marina Shed which houses the electrical box and water treatment for the Marina, needs to be replaced and the new shed set on a concrete pad.

The Board's goal is to raise \$30,000 so that proper replacements can be effected. The donations sent in will be segregated from operating expenses and will only be used for the Pavilion and Shed.

There will be a Donor Board erected at the new Pavilion in appreciation of the monies given.

They say that every society should enhance the surroundings and leave it better than before. I know my own children, who were raised in NORTH SHORE, have great memories of fun at the Beach.

I will keep all abreast of the fund raising success.

The Dogwood

Celebrate the arrival of spring with The Dogwood cocktail. This citrusy beverage is mixed with grapefruit juice, vodka, and elderflower liqueur. You'll want to garnish with fragrant lemon and fresh rosemary.

Yield: Makes 1 serving

Ingredients:

1/4 cup white grapefruit juice

3 tablespoons vodka

1 tablespoon elderflower liqueur

Ice cubes

Garnish: lemon wheel, fresh rosemary sprig

Preparation

Combine white grapefruit juice, vodka, and elderflower liqueur in a cocktail shaker filled with ice cubes. Cover with lid, and shake vigorously until thoroughly chilled (about 30 seconds). Strain into an 8-oz. glass filled with ice cubes. Garnish, if desired.

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
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
