

Minutes from the Meeting  
of the  
North Shore Board of Governors  
September 3, 2013

The regular monthly meeting of the North Shore Board of Governors was held on September 3, 2013 at the Beach. The meeting was called to order at 7:10pm. In attendance were board members Wayne and Amy Bartholomee, Rae Regula, Lana Matovcik, Bonnie Howatt, Jennifer Harris, Sarah Ann Parsons, Carl Kuhne, Robin Gearhart-Sayler, Rick Scruggs, Jeff Schell and Mike Davis.

Entertainment

Preparations for the Crab Feast were first on the Board's agenda. The response this year has been tremendous with 115 planning to attend – almost double last year's attendance. This is a great result as it is our primary fund raiser for the year. Several members volunteered to help put up the tarp on Friday evening. Set up for the event begins at 12:00 noon on Saturday. A small dumpster has been arranged to take care of the trash from the event. Jennifer Harris has done a superb job planning, preparing and promoting this event, and many members of the Board have chipped in to help coordinate all the details. Great team effort!

Treasurer's Report

Operating Revenues for the month of July were approximately \$4500.00. After expenses of \$3000.00, (including liability insurance, tree trimming at the park and maintenance items at the pier) the general fund balance at the end of the month was approximately \$26,000.00. For August, Operating revenues were \$700.00, and expenses of \$2500.00 leave a balance of \$24,400.00.

As of August 31, the balance in the Capital Improvement Fund was \$11,600 and the Prudent Reserve CD remains at just under \$16,000.00.

Donations for the Pavilion during August totaled \$10,000. Total contributions earmarked for the Pavilion and Beach Improvements is now \$11,600.00. All contributions of any size are encouraged and appreciated.

Pavilion Progress

A site survey has been completed and permit application filed with Anne Arundel County. Discussion ensued regarding the bidding process for the pavilion work. Ted was traveling and unable to give a full report, but Wayne advised that we have previously obtained two bids for the work. The Board agreed to seek additional bids, but not until we complete the permitting process.

The Board is greatly encouraged by the donations for this project. We will continue to include an optional feature piece in the Barnacle for anyone contributing \$500.00 or more toward the pavilion improvements. We will also include a list of donors in each Barnacle. Carl has some historical photos of the pavilion and volunteered to write an article about the history and important role of the pavilion in the community.

Beach

The beach has been reserved for September 26<sup>th</sup> by Rick Scruggs. Wayne will follow up to make sure that those who have previously reserved the beach have paid the stipulated rent as well as their membership dues.

Garden Club

The garden club is proceeding with its plans to re-vamp the beach garden so that it will be less labor-intensive. There was some discussion as to whether the new garden should be delayed until after the pavilion work is complete and the Board concluded that was not necessary. They will consider hiring outside help to remove existing vegetation when they are ready to move forward with the new garden plans.

The Holiday Open House is scheduled for December 6. The Garden Club is in need of two houses to participate. If you would consider opening your home for this traditional community event, please contact Sara Ann Parsons or any member of the Garden Club.

Sara Ann also has produced a draft of a new Porthole and circulated a preliminary copy for review. If you need to update your information from the old Porthole directory, please let her know.

Membership

There are 145 paid households to date out of a total of 187 homes (excluding Villa Isle), which have yielded \$11,800 in dues collections. Of the 42 unpaid, 29 have never paid community dues and are not likely to come around, so our optimum goal is 153 households. We have hit the 95% benchmark, with only 13 to go – a fantastic year so far!! We are still accepting Community Membership for this year – could we make it 100%? If you have not already done so, please submit your dues to Robin Sayler. Thank you to all who have participated. A list of current members is included in the current Barnacle.

Park

The only issue with the park at present is the need for a new basketball net. Brian Siwinski has offered to donate a backboard and hoops. Wayne has several nets and will donate them to the community.

Pier/Marina

All assigned slips are paid to date. Two members have inquired about the possibility of renting a second slip, which is presently not permitted under the Marina Rules. The 2013 waiting list originally had nine requests for upgraded slips. Three have been approved and assigned. Three cannot be accommodated due to the size of their boats. They will remain on the priority list in the order of their request until something opens up.

With these circumstances, Jeff suggested that the Board consider a rule change to allow members to rent a second slip, provided that it is first offered for a period of time to the membership. Any second slip rental would be on an annual renewal basis, subject, again to the first priority of other members not already slip holders. The Board agreed, and Jeff will begin the process of amending the Marina Rules in this manner.

Jeff also will look into the possibility and cost effectiveness of moving a few pilings to turn presently unusable slips into a more desirable and useful arrangement.

Fifty-one out of Sixty-Six key holders have paid the annual key rental fee. Of those not paid, only four are currently using the ramp. Jeff is following up on the unpaid key holders. If you have not renewed your ramp key for 2013, please do so or turn in your key so that we can avoid the costly process of putting a new lock on the ramp.

Rick asked whether anyone is aware of any grant funds available for dredging community ramps and piers. Jeff is going to look into the matter, but the consensus was that it was unlikely in the present economy. Carl has spoken with members from the Sillery Bay community and learned that there is a program where the County will advance funds needed for dredging, but required the affirmative vote of a super majority of community members and ultimately is added to their property tax bills. There was no interest in pursuing this course of action.

Finally, Jeff asked about the possibility of a message board for the marina/ramp area which could be used to provide a current posting of all available slips, and would also post the name and slip numbers of the existing slip holders so that anyone noticing an unsafe condition or other item needing attention could alert the slip holder. He has found a weatherproof board for \$150.00. All agreed this was a good idea. Even better, Wayne and Amy's son is in need of an Eagle Scout project and thought this might be just the right thing. Amy and Jeff agreed to collaborate after the meeting.

#### Roads and Zoning

The only submissions to Roads and Zoning were 2 tree removals. Nothing further to report.

#### New Business

Rae Regula is making plans for a community clean up day this fall. Stay posted for more details to come.

The board has received several emails and other correspondence regarding

unsupervised children playing in the dangerous street corner on Edgewater Road. We are all concerned about this situation, but aside from expressing neighborly concern, it is not a matter in the board's jurisdiction. There are governmental agencies which do exert jurisdiction over these issues, if anyone believes the situation merits their involvement. Let your conscience be your guide and please drive appropriately.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.

The next meeting will be held on October 1 at the home of Carl Kuhne.


