## Heroin

Heroin usage and resulting overdoses have escalated in this county and state. County Executive Steve Schuh and Governor Larry Hogan have declared the heroin problem as a public health and safety emergency. In 2014 there were 308 heroin and opioid overdoses in Anne Arundel County, 48 of which were fatal.

Governor Hogan has set up a four point program to address the heroin emergency. His four-point program includes two executive orders — one to create a coordinating council of the agencies involved in tackling the problem and the other setting up the task force. Lt. Gov. Boyd Rutherford will chair both groups. The third point was Hogan's announcement of a donation of 5,000 EVZIO kits for the rapid treatment of heroin and other opiate overdoses by manufacturer Kaleo Pharmaceuticals. EVZIO is a delivery device similar to an epi-pen for the delivery of naloxone, a drug used to counter the effects of those substances in emergencies. Each kit has two doses, for a total of 10,000 and are being distributed to emergency responders. Hogan also announced a \$500,000 federal grant to the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention that will be used to increase treatment programs in the state's jails and prisons.

In December, 2014 Steve Schuh held a meeting of the Anne Arundel County's Heroin Action Task Force, comprised of county health, public safety, education, social services and criminal justice agencies, the result was an action plan

Broadly, the Heroin Action Taskforce three-pronged action plan contains the following elements:

- **Education:** Education of our citizens, especially our children, through targeted public awareness campaigns and community engagement.
- **Treatment Opportunities:** Expanded treatment opportunities by investing in programs that break the cycle of addiction once it begins.
- **Increased Enforcement:** Targeted public safety investments in specialty tactical units to neutralize the gangs and dealers that traffic in heroin.

In the county budget for fiscal year 2015-2016 County Executive provided allocations as follows to fund the heroin crisis initiatives:

- Investing \$800,000 for the Health Department to initiate a new substance abuse treatment center.
- Increasing by 25% community grant for substance abuse providers to nearly \$375,000.
- Investing more than \$500,000 to fund a heroin enforcement intra-county task force.
- Doubling the budget for the Police Department's Drug Diversion Squad to more than \$240,000.
- Nearly doubling the budget for crucial tools in the heroin fight, such as Narcan, to more than \$85,000.

How does this affect us?? As parents, we are the first source of prevention by educating ourselves and children on the perils of drug use as well as questioning unusual behavior/activities. As neighbors if

- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan



## Directions

- 1 Heat oven to 350° F. Coat a 13-by-9-inch baking dish with cooking spray and spoon in a third of the sauce.
- 2 Arrange 12 ravioli on top and scatter the spinach over them. Top with half of each cheese. Cover with another layer of ravioli and the remaining sauce and cheese.
- 3 Cover with foil and bake 25 minutes. Uncover and bake 5 to 10 minutes more or until bubbly.


