The public areas that belong to the association, namely the community beach, the community pier, and the community boat slips and boat ramp are for the use and entitlement of only paid members. The yearly dues of paid members maintains and supports the upkeep of these properties. Expenses include \$160 in monthly fees for portable toilets, approximately \$8000 in yearly insurance, \$150 in weekly fees to mow the lawns at the park and beach, among other expenses. The Association also puts on free events such as Family Day, the Easter Egg Hunt, the Halloween Parade and Party and Hayride, Santa's visit, the Fourth of July parade and party, to name a few. These funds are generated by the annual membership dues of those members of our community that join the association. Residence in North Shore does not entitle your use of these facilities, however, paying your yearly membership, does. North Shore Association dues are \$100 per family per

year and \$50 for senior families per year. Please step to the plate and pull your fair share, or please refrain from using the facilities that are paid for by our members.

Salute before eating!

- 1 small package lime gelatin
- 1 small package orange gelatin
- 2 cups hot water
- 1 cup orange juice
- 1 can mandarin orange pieces, drained
- 1 banana, sliced
- 1 cup orange pineapple ice cream (or vanilla)
- ¾ cup cottage cheese

Combine lime gelatin, orange gelatin, and hot water. Stir constantly 2-3 minutes, until dissolved. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Chill until completely set. Serve on tin plates or little tin buckets. Stick in a small flag for a festive decoration.
