How Far Can You See?

This year the answer is 43 inches or three feet, seven inches. That is how deep the water was when a group of North Shore people last saw their toes. It was the first wade-in for the Bay at North Shore. We plan to do it during each Fourth of July celebration as a way to monitor the health of the Magothy River. Communities up and down the Bay have started wading in

annually to monitor the clarity of the Bay. It started more than 20 years ago in Southern Maryland with Sen. Bernie Fowler leading the waders as an informal effort to involve citizens in the Bay clean-up and make them aware of the Bay's health. Today, there are scores of such activities and include the governor, US Senators, Congressmen, school groups and, now, North Shorers. Longtime North Shorers say the water is clearer this year than it has been for a long time. Starting this year, we will know how it compares each year. We will record the results each year at the beach so you can compare. For example, you can note on your body 43 inches by standing next to the marker and then wade on out. See if the water gets as high as the mark for 43 inches on your body and you still can see your toes. If it gets that high, the water clarity is the same. If it gets higher, the water clarity is better. If it does not get that high, the algae and sediment are blocking your view and the water is not as clear. This means that not as much sunlight can reach the river vegetation which is home for the baby crabs, soft-shell crabs and fish. This sub-aquatic vegetation (SAV) needs sunlight to grow. The more sunlight, the more SAV and the healthier habitat for fish and crabs. This means more and healthier fish and crabs. Wade on in. The water is warm...and clear. Keep up the good work saving the Bay.


