

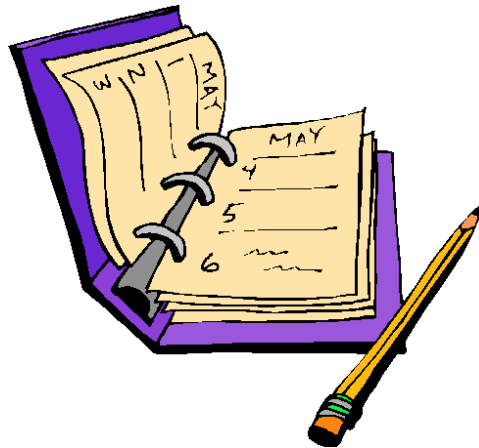

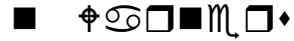

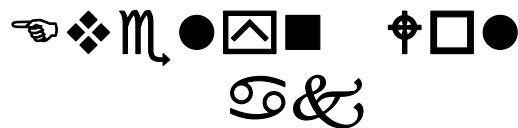
These 4th generation North Shoreans arrived approximately 10 weeks early!
