

The meeting was called to order by the President Nancy Bassler at 7:10 p.m. at the home of Bob Douglas.

The first order of business was to introduce the guests. Bob DeRemer was in attendance as an observer but did ask if something could be done about the vacant garage across the street from his home. Our information is that according to the owners, who are in the process of getting permits from the county to demolish the house and garage and to rebuild, they have tried to clean up the area and have opened up the garage and removed the old car. However, the property continues to be vandalized which has made it difficult. Hopefully, the problem will be solved shortly.

PARK: Bob Douglas presented the signs that will be displayed at the park. He asked for suggestions as to how we can install these signs to keep them from being defaced. Plexiglass was one suggestion. Anyone with ideas should contact Bob. Also, anyone whose name is on the sign is entitled to a T-shirt. Again, contact Bob. Also, community members who may have been forgotten in their contribution to the park and whose name is not on the sign should let us know so they can be added.

A suggestion has been made that perhaps there are teenagers in the neighborhood who could be designated as Park Rangers to help keep it clean and in good condition.

They need some additional fill dirt and top soil at the park.

PIER: Bill Morris said the ice eaters will be installed when the weather warrants it. The electrical work has been completed. There will be some vacancies at the pier next year and they will be announced at the annual meeting in February.

A suggestion was made that the Board be given a list of those pier slips that are already rented.

ROADS AND ZONING: Brian Siwinski reported for Terri that another letter will be sent to the resident with the unlicensed cars in their yard if these cars have not been removed.

Nancy said she had a call from Bob and Sadie Lane at 1191 Long Cove that they are removing 2 dead trees and from Bob Eckhart at 434 Park Creek that he is removing some dead trees.

BARNACLE: Articles are due to Amy Bartholomee by Sunday, November 5, 2005.

WELCOME: No report.

ENTERTAINMENT: Rose Butts reported that the Halloween Parade went well and that there were 3 hayrides in the community in addition to the adult hayride and that everyone had fun.

Last Friday of the Month has been a huge success with 20-25 people participating. This tradition will probably not begin again until spring due to the weather. It was suggested that more publicity about it should be posted.

The Christmas Tree Lighting will be on December 11. A garage is still needed for Santa and we need a Santa.

The Garden Club is looking for 2 or 3 homes for the Christmas Homes Tour.

OLD BUSINESS:

It was announced that the Fishing Tournament was a huge success.

Nancy has sent in our grant application to the county and the results should be known by December 16.

An in-depth discussion was held on the recent survey of community property.

Nancy announced the wonderful contribution that has been made in maintaining and beautifying the North Shore sign and community areas by Harry and Jerri Rupperecht. We truly appreciate their immense contributions and voted to do something to show our appreciation for the Rupperechts.

Ted Tepper announced that he has information that BGE will be installing all new transmission lines to North Shore from Mountain Road beginning in January. We will be on our own circuits and this should make it easier to identify and solve problems when they arise.

A huge thank you goes to Amy Bartholomee for all her hard work in getting the Barnacle together. Thanks.

The Annual Meeting will be held on February 7, 2006.

The next meeting will be held at the home of Denise Larbig on December 6 at 7 p.m.

Oyster Stew

From *Coastal Living*

- 3 (12-ounce) containers fresh oysters, undrained
- 1/2 cup butter
- 6 shallots, minced
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3 pints half-and-half
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 3/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/3 cup vermouth
- Garnish with chopped fresh parsley

Drain oysters, reserving 3/4 cup liquid.

Melt butter in a skillet; add shallots, and sauté until tender. Whisk in flour; cook, whisking constantly, 1 minute. Gradually add reserved oyster liquid and half-and-half; cook over medium heat, whisking constantly, until thickened and bubbly. Add oysters, and cook 5 minutes or until done. Stir in salt, pepper, and vermouth. Garnish, if desired; serve immediately.

NOTE: This oyster stew recipe is typical of those made in the South.

Hot German Potato Salad

INGREDIENTS

- 2 pounds small red potatoes
- 6 tablespoons white wine vinegar, divided
- Cooking spray
- 1/2 cup finely chopped red onion
- 4 ounces turkey kielbasa, diced
- 1/2 cup fat-free, less-sodium chicken broth
- 3 bacon slices, cooked and crumbled
- 1 teaspoon caraway seeds
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup minced fresh parsley

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place potatoes in a saucepan, and cover with water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer 10 minutes or until tender. Drain; cool slightly. Cut potatoes in half lengthwise; cut halves crosswise into 1/4-inch-thick slices. Place potatoes in a large bowl; sprinkle with 2 tablespoons vinegar.
2. Heat a large nonstick skillet coated with cooking spray over medium heat. Add onion and kielbasa to pan; cook 3 minutes or until onion is tender. Add 1/4 cup vinegar, broth, and bacon. Bring to a boil; cook 1 minute. Stir in caraway seeds, salt, and pepper.
3. Pour vinegar mixture over potato slices; toss gently. Sprinkle with parsley. Serve immediately.
