

MEMBERSHIP:

Jon Williams reported that there have been no changes in the membership since the last meeting. He is planning for next year.

BEACH:

Andy and Nancy Bassler met with several county officials to discuss the demolition of the tennis court and the possibility of relocating it to the park. The county was very supportive of the direction the community is taking and they have sent a letter to that effect.

It will be necessary to do a topographical study completed with an engineers stamp and to apply for grading permits and any other permits needed for the improvements. Although there are no definite plans to build a tennis court or an all purpose court at the park, since the permits will be good for three years and since we have the county's support at this time, the plans are to apply for all permits for present and future use.

PARK:

There was some vandalism at the park. The responsible parties have been contacted and will take care of repairing the damage.

PIER:

Bill Morris reported that there was a burst pipe at the pier but it was taken care of and the water has been shut off.

ROADS AND ZONING:

There was a follow-up report on some unlicensed vehicles in the community but that has been resolved.

The Berthas at 465 Edgewater informed the board that they will be having a dead tree removed in the spring. Bill Morris at 371 Dutchship Court and Denise Larbig at 420 Park Creek Court will also have some dead trees removed.

It was noted that the plans that were presented by Claire and Bery Edmonston for the renovation of their home at 530 Edgewater Road and already approved by the board will be the plans used by the new owner of their property, David Clickner. No further review is needed.

Plans were presented to demolish and rebuild the home at 385 Edgewater Road owned by Dean Hildebrand. The setbacks are in accordance with the North Shore Covenants so the plans were approved contingent on Mr. Hildebrand obtaining the proper signatures of the neighbors.

ENTERTAINMENT:

The Garden Club is sponsoring the annual Homes Tour on Friday, December 16. Everyone is encouraged to attend.

Since the last printing of the Barnacle, I have received numerous calls from residents airing a variety of complaints. None of the issues are

addressed in the Association bylaws or covenants; therefore the Board has no jurisdiction in these matters. I call the community's attention to these problems in hopes that in the spirit of "good neighboring" the offenders will take the initiative to correct the situation.

1. By now most of us have winterized our recreational vehicles from the summer. I have received a number of complaints from residents about boats, trailers, vehicles, etc. being stored in their neighbor's front yards. We all need to be aware of the new and perhaps unpleasant view we have created for our neighbors as they gaze out their front windows. Let's all try to find a discreet spot (if possible) in our yards to store our "toys" and make our neighbor's view a pleasant one.

2. Once again I have received complaints about unlicensed vehicles traveling on our community roads. I have advised those who have called to direct their complaints to the county police.

3. Freezing temperatures have fostered a reoccurring road problem. Several residents throughout the community release water into the street from their homes. This time of year it creates an icy patch that is dangerous for walkers and drivers alike. Last year I had a community member phone to say she had "spun out" on a snow covered patch of ice in her SUV. During these months of freezing weather please divert your water away from the road to a place where it will not become a hazard.

Old-Fashioned Biscuits

Preparation: 10 min. Oven temperature: 400°F
 Baking time: 15 min. Yields: 12 Calories: 149 each

<p>INGREDIENTS:</p> <p>2 cups all-purpose flour 2½ tsp. baking powder ½ tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. salt 1 Tbsp. sugar ½ cup butter, margarine or shortening ¾ cup buttermilk</p> <p>Tips: These biscuits are best served hot. However, if you have leftovers, they can be toasted and used as a base for poached or creamed eggs, ham or tuna.</p>	<p>PREPARATION:</p> <p>1 Mix flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, and sugar in mixing bowl. 2 Cut in butter or shortening until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. 3 With fork, stir in buttermilk to make a soft dough. Turn out onto lightly floured board and knead about 10 times to form a smooth ball. Do not overknead or biscuits will not be tender. 4 Roll out to a 6-by-6-inch square. Place on ungreased baking sheet. With knife, cut dough into 12 portions (see photo). Do not separate; leave biscuits in a square. 5 Bake at 400°F until golden, about 15 minutes.</p> <p>Good served with: Butter and honey or homemade jams or preserves. A classic to serve with Southern-style fried chicken.</p>


