PARK:

Bud reported all of the basketball nets are up. He repaired the NSA benches and set them in the park by the playground equipment. Mulch, donated

by Brenda Deriemer, was used in the playground equipment area.

PIER:

Jon Williams spoke to our insurance agent regarding the Association's liability coverage at the Pier facility. Jon was assured that the insurance coverage NSA has is comprehensive.

The new key and lock system at the Pier causes the key to stay engaged in the lock while the lock is open and can only be removed when the lock is closed. The keys are numbered and the Pier Chairman has a list of key holders by key number. This system was set up to prevent unauthorized use of the Pier facility. Each key holder is responsible for any use of their key and should accompany to the Pier anyone using their key.

ROADS AND ZONING:

A letter was sent on May 26 by the NSA attorney regarding removal of the shed that is encroaching on the NSA Beach Property. The letter was sent to the attorney of the property owner at 1199 Long Cove Road.

GARDEN CLUB:

There was no report. The North Shore Board wants to thank the Garden club members and other residents for their tireless efforts in keeping the North Shore garden spots so bloomin' beautiful!!

NEW BUSINESS:

A concerned neighbor questioned if the North Shore By-Laws are enforceable.

Jon Williams was assured by our Real Estate Attorney that they are enforceable.

The North Shore sign at Mountain & North Shore Roads was destroyed as the result of an automobile accident. Jon Williams has been in contact with the owner of the car, Mary Ferrell. Ms. Ferrell sent an EMAIL stating her relative who was driving the car 'sends his apology and he has learned a lesson'. Ms. Ferrell will replace the sign as it was before the accident. She has submitted a spec sheet from Construction Concepts Darryl Preissler with a tentative start date of June 13. The NSA Board has decided to work with Ms. Ferrell to replace the sign. Denny Debus will supervise the sign rebuilding.

County Executive Janet S. Owens Announces Fireworks in North County

Annapolis, MD (June 16, 2006) Anne Arundel County Executive Janet S. Owens announced the return of fireworks to Downs Park in Pasadena. "I am so happy that after a seven year absence, the excitement and thrill of a good fireworks display will be enjoyed by our North County residents again," said County Executive Janet S. Owens.

Downs Park is located near the end of Mountain Road at 8311 John Downs Loop. The fireworks display will be held

Monday, July 3, 2006 at 9:15 PM. The park will be closed on the 3rd until 6:00 PM and no one will be allowed in the park before then.

All parking for the event will be at Chesapeake Middle School and Bodkin Elementary. Free shuttle bus service will be provided to and from the park beginning at 6:00 PM. The buses will load and unload in front of Bodkin Elementary on Ventnor Road. No parking will be allowed in or around Downs Park or the surrounding communities, unless you have a state issued handicap sticker or placard.

Pedestrian traffic will not be allowed between the school complex and the park. The Anne Arundel County Police will limit vehicular traffic beyond the school complex to only residents of the communities located East of Ventnor Road. People planning to attend this event are encouraged to come early. Once parking at the school complex is full, no further admission to the event will be permitted.

At the conclusion of the fireworks display, shuttle bus service will resume and continue until the park is clear. All busses will unload in front of Bodkin Elementary. Busses will not go to individual schools. This will improve the traffic pattern and speed your exit.

Please be reminded the following are not permitted in the park: No alcoholic beverages, no fireworks, sparklers, etc., no pets and no swimming. Coolers will be subject to inspection. Snacks and beverages will be available from the park concession. For more information: call Downs Park at (410) 222-6230.
