The meeting was called to order at 7:10PM at the home of Brian Siwinski.

North Shore Special Board Meeting December 19, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 PM at the home of Fran Kuhne.

This meeting was held to decide the next action the North Shore Board will take to deal with non-compliance of North Shore Covenants at 457 Edgewater Road. The property owner has proceeded with building and has not gotten approval from the North Shore Board of Governors as required in the North Shore Covenants.

A motion was made by Nancy Bassler to file suit against the property owner at 457 Edgewater Road for non-compliance with Restrictive Covenant #3. This requires property owners to submit plans for building change and obtain approval of these plans by the North Shore Board before construction begins. The motion was seconded, voted on and approved 6 yes to 1 no. The no vote was Wayne Bartholomee.

A second motion was made by Wayne Bartholomee to contact the attorney for a copy of the papers he has prepared to date, determine if suit is ready for filing and determine the cost of filing. An amount of \$500.00 be allocated for attorney fees for this activity and no suit filed until the above data was received and presented to the board. This motion was seconded but did not pass with a vote of 3 yes and 4 no. The yes votes were Wayne Bartholomee, Brian Siwinski, and Bill Morris.

A third motion was made by Fran Kuhne to contact the attorney, get a copy of the suit papers he has prepared, get a cost estimate for filing suit and request him to proceed with filing suit against the property owner at 457 Edgewater Road if the cost is \$700.00 or less. This motion was seconded and passed with a vote of 6 yes and 1 no. No vote Wayne Bartholomee.

Jon Williams will contact the attorney on 12/20/06 and proceed per the third motion.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:10PM

James "Jim" Durick, 61, of Pasadena died Dec. 5 at Baltimore Washington Medical Center.

He was born Sept. 11, 1945, in Youngstown, Ohio, and lived in Ohio before moving to Pasadena 35 years ago. He was in sales for 15 years at Johnson and Towers Inc.

Mr. Durick performed with the 1st Army Band at Fort George G. Meade while serving in the Army from 1966 to 1969. A musician who played saxophone and trombone, he also enjoyed boating, baseball and antique cars.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Julia and Joseph Durick Sr.

Survivors include his wife of 38 years, Suzanne A. Durick; one son, James "J.D." Durick of Manassas, Va.; one brother, Joseph Durick Jr. of Strathers, Ohio; and one grandchild.

Funeral services were held at Stallings Funeral Home. Interment was in Maryland Veterans Cemetery in Crownsville.

Walter Eugene Williams Sr., a retired Baltimore hospital administrator, died of Parkinson's disease Friday at the Genesis Eldercare facility in Severna Park. The Annapolis resident was 83.

He played a key role in establishing a burn center at Baltimore City Hospitals (now Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center) and in the development of the Waxter Senior Center.

He was a deputy director of Baltimore City Hospitals from 1962 to 1977 and vice president at Sheppard and Enoch Pratt Hospital from 1977 until his retirement in 1995.

Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., he graduated from the New York State Maritime Academy in 1944 and joined the merchant marine. He served as a first mate on ships during World War II, and he transported troops and supplies home from Japan and Italy at the end of the war.

He then resumed his studies, receiving a bachelor's degree from Manhattan College in 1948 and a master's degree in sanitary engineering from the University of Minnesota in 1950.

He worked for the Naugatuck Rubber Co. in Connecticut, managing plants in the Naugatuck River Valley and Beacon Falls. He left in 1958 to take over his late father's plumbing business in Brooklyn, but quickly decided he did not like the business.

The next year, he took a position as plant engineer for Muhlenberg Hospital in Plainfield, N.J., staying until his 1962 move to Baltimore.

He married Mary Monica Stack Sater in 1972; the couple would have celebrated their 34th anniversary Dec. 9. An earlier marriage ended in divorce.

He lived in several locations in Maryland, including Pasadena, where he served on the board of the North Shore Association.

He was a member of St. Mary Roman Catholic Church in Annapolis.

He was a lifetime member of the American Hospital Association and the International Facility Management Association.

He enjoyed sailing on the Chesapeake Bay, baseball, woodcarving and chess.

A Mass of Christian burial will be offered at 9:30 a.m. tomorrow at St. John Neumann Roman Catholic Church, 620 Bestgate Road, Annapolis.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons, Walter E. Williams Jr. of New York City and Paul Williams of Columbia; two daughters, Katherine Nikolaiev of Houston and Susan Williams of Baltimore; two stepsons, William D. Sater of Loveland, Colo., and John E. Sater of Waynesboro, Pa.; two stepdaughters, Leslie Sater of Pasadena and Mary Page Sater of Baltimore; and 10 grandchildren.
