

## Work at the Marina

A lot of work has been going on at the marina.

All of the water is on at the marina and is now on a water softener system, it is working very well to remove the rust out of the water.

A new shed has been put in place and all of the electrical has been moved and updated into the existing panel by the new shed. We will be moving the panel into the shed for a more secure location at a later date.

A new hose bib has been added to the ramp for anyone to wash their boats off while taking them out.

All of the light bulbs have been replaced with LEDs to help with the electric bill.

The west side of the marina now has water where there was always a issue with it before.

South of the shed there still is no electric and should be repaired soon, north of the shed all of the electric has been updated and new waterproof in-service hoods have been installed.

A donation was made by Shoreline to the marina to spread crush and run at the end of the driveway and fill in some of the holes from work that was performed on the electrical repairs.

There is a large concern for the condition of the current bulkhead all around the marina except for the portion that was replaced on the south/west side. The bulkhead is falling into the marina and a lot of capping is missing. I am working on getting quotes on the replacement

of the severe parts first and maintenance dredging of the entire marina. We are hoping to have the work on the bulkhead done in late fall, and possible dredging in the early spring while the leaves are off the trees.

The boat ramp will also be addressed this winter with the lower tides.



Security is still a big issue at the marina with more theft of batteries. I was a victim last year and have been working very hard for solutions. I personally have added a locking hasp to my battery lid and was not a victim of theft last month.

More lighting and security cameras will hopefully be added this summer with wifi at the marina so slip holders will be able to view their assets in real time.

I look forward to help improve this great asset for everyone in our community.

## Mountain Road Revitalization

Looks like this project has made it to the front burner for County Executive Steve Schuh.

Plans for the \$23 million project have been included in his Fiscal Year 2017 budget. This initial plan includes a one-mile stretch from Outing Avenue to Edwin Raynor Boulevard. Owen McEvoy, public information officer for the county executive, said that the section was selected because of its lack of turn lanes in some places, complete absence of sidewalks and its tendency to create enormous amounts of traffic.

NOTE: The County Council can accept, flat out reject or modify this component of the budget. All Pasadena residents are encouraged to make your desires known to their County Council rep. If you support the project ask that they leave that component of the budget alone and fully in tact.

## Minutes from the Meeting of the North Shore Board of Governors May 3, 2016

The regular monthly meeting of the North Shore Board of Governors was held on May 3, hosted by Ben and Kelly Wisthoff. The meeting was called to order at 7:03. In attendance at the meeting were Lisa Stamper, Ben Wisthoff, Marion Glasby, Laurie Gardner, David Klatt, Doug O'Connell, Rick Scruggs, Amy Bartholomee, Tracy Poyneer, Lana Matovcik, and Jeanne Brush.

The minutes of the April meeting of the Board were approved as submitted.

### Treasurer's Report

The General Fund opening balance in April was \$18535. Total revenue for the month was

\$9826.05, primarily from membership dues and slip rentals. Expenses totaled \$6609.96, including \$4,388 for ongoing work at the pier and \$1,707 for expenses related to the Earth Day Clean Up event. The ending balance was \$21,751.09. The reserve Fund CD balance ended the month at \$28,125.00 The Garden Club balance is \$1,074.27

### Beach

In addition to the 8 community events scheduled for the beach this season, we have 5 individual beach rentals.

Special thanks to all the North Shore residents that helped clean up the beach on Earth Day Clean Up. The beach grounds and pavilion are now in excellent shape and ready for all the scheduled community events and individual beach rentals.

A pallet load of paver stones has been donated by Bob and Sadie Lane. These pavers are certified to go in the water and Ben suggested they could be used to bolster the jetty which protects our beach. The Board discussed several other potential uses, and in the end we agreed to consult with the Get It Done Committee for their input. Thanks to the Lanes for the donation. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board members voted to provide a complimentary 1-year membership to the Lanes.

The combination lock on the beach chain has not been changed for several years, and we have no way to know how many unauthorized people know the combination. It has been suggested that we change the lock combination each year. We do not know who has the key to change the combination. Doug suggested that we get a new lock for about \$20.00 and plan to change the combination once a year. All board members agreed.

Rae Regula has kindly offered to donate a used propane grill and a badminton set to the beach. The board thought the badminton set would be a nice addition to the recreation options at the beach, but declined the offer for the propane grill because of past vandalism and other issues. Wendy Warner also has offered to donate 2 new

volleyball nets, which we will put in storage for future use.

### Membership

There are currently 147 paid or comped members out of a total of 183 properties. This represents a 79% participation rate. The final total of paid or comped memberships in FY 2015/2016 was 157. Nine new families received a complimentary membership last year. All nine have paid dues for this year. To date, 35 neighbors have not paid dues. Of those 35, there is one vacant house, three properties on the market, and half a dozen or so who have never paid dues. The Board discussed the idea of publishing the names of non-paying residents, but decided that was inconsistent with the notion of a voluntary HOA.

### Pier

David reports that almost all slips are paid. One unpaid slip holder is out of town, and the other is not going to renew this year.

The planned electric work is about 98% complete and all is set up for the new panel to be installed in the shed. David and the electrician have been working to troubleshoot the remaining unexpected issues that were caused by the County when they installed the new drainage system. That will need to be completed on an hourly basis and will likely cost between \$500 - \$1500 to fix. There are 11 circuits affected.

David has researched and has some pretty detailed plans for security at the marina. The electric service has been set up to handle whatever we need going forward.

The Board confirmed that the \$1000 fund we authorized at the last meeting should be considered available at any time on an ongoing basis to address potentially hazardous conditions at the marina without waiting for Board approval.

The next immediate items on the agenda will be capping pilings, adding cleats, hose hangers, etc. The driveway also needs grading and paving. Looking forward, the next major project will be to replace 75 feet of bulkhead. Security will be addressed next summer.

Thanks to Tim Young for fixing the damages caused by the County's work on the property.

Tracy will follow up to locate the key for the kiosk.

David is going to replace the kiosk roof with a heavier gauge material.

David asked whether a prepaid slip rental should be refunded to a member who no longer wishes to renew. Upon motion made by Rick, and seconded by Ben, the Board voted to refund the fee.

Amy will ask Wayne to follow up on the tree trimming that was to occur at the Marina.

### Roads & Zoning

Laurie had no new applications this month. She mentioned there is work ongoing at the Wagner property, which is not subject to our restrictive covenants. She is also going to reach

out to a neighbor about trimming trees which encroach on the road.

### Entertainment

Sixty people participated in the Earth Day Clean Up event. One Chesapeake High School student will be credited with three hours of community service toward their graduation requirements.

The Spring Fling is planned for May 21, 1:00-3:00 pm (rain date 5/22) and Tracy is planning to include a Community Yard Sale in the morning, prior to the event. Tables at the beach will be available on a first-come first-serve basis. Residents are welcome to set up their own tables at their home or at the beach or park.

### Garden Club

There is still some mulch that needs to be spread, and Lisa hopes to get that completed this weekend. The Garden Club is continuing its discussions about how to make the garden at the park more manageable and less labor-intensive. Laurie added solar lights to one of the gardens, which all thought were a nice addition. Straw bales are coming soon.

The Garden Club meets on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month, with the next meeting on the 17<sup>th</sup> at Cris Imle's house (469 Edgewater).

### Park

The park is in good condition, thanks to all the people who came out and helped with the clean-up. They really made a significant impact on the looks of the park. There are a couple of small issues that need attention. There is a hole at the drain grate in the center of the grass area. It looks like an animal has burrowed in the ground next to the grate and left a hole that

could be dangerous. It is currently covered with a bale of straw to keep anybody from accidentally stepping into it. Rick wants to fill it with cinder blocks, filter fabric and new fill dirt. Also the teeter totter swing has been damaged, and appears to have been overloaded. Rick suggested, and upon motion made by Laurie, and seconded by Ben, the Board approved the purchase of another baby swing for up to \$50.00.
